RE: DEQ G3 Progressive System v7.1.2

Dear Ms. Morin,

Thank you for requesting approval of the G3 Progressive System v7.1.2. We have completed our review.

The G3 Progressive System is approved for use in Washington State. We are approving the G3 Progressive System with the following requirements:

Manufacturer Requirements:

- If the licensee plans to connect progressive jackpots on different card games on multiple tables, ensure the licensed location is aware that only one progressive jackpot is operated on a card game at a time. In addition, the card games must have the same probability of winning the jackpot prize, the same winning hand, and the progressive meter on each table must increment each time a wager is made.
- Notification to the Washington State Gambling Commission must be made prior to the first installation in Washington and each installation thereafter so arrangements may be made for Agent inspection/review. Please provide a list to include specific locations, dates and times this system will be installed at least 10 business days prior to installation. Send the list to Sonja Dolson at sonja.dolson@wsgc.wa.gov
- You must update your game rules for games that will use the G3 Progressive System prior to installing equipment in Washington. If the G3 Progressive System is used on proprietary games not owned by DEQ, then those rules will have to be updated to identify the use of the G3 system with their games prior to installing the equipment as well.



Operator Requirements:

- Licensees must maintain a closed gambling equipment system that is isolated from non-gambling systems and inaccessible from outside networks.
- Gaming tables must be connected to the system by standard computer network connections, and not wireless connections.
- When connecting a progressive jackpot on different card games on multiple tables within your location, only one progressive jackpot may be operated on a card game at a time. The card games must have the same probability of winning the jackpot prize, the same winning hand, and the progressive meter on each table must increase incrementally each time a wager is made.
- Licensees must follow all progressive jackpot WAC rules.
- Licensees must ensure primary jackpot cap amounts and procedures for paying out jackpots when multiple jackpots are hit at the same time are included in their internal controls.
- Licensees must ensure chips are placed on the center of the sensor to ensure all wagers are accurately recorded.

Tribal Casino Implementation:

- For Tribal Casinos, ensure internal controls are revised to include new equipment and procedures, and approved by Tribal Gaming Agency and concurred with by Washington State Gambling Commission.

The G3Progressive System v7.1.2. as submitted and reviewed did not include such features as Lucky Player Jackpot, Magic Card Player, Lucky Player & Lucky Table, Hot Spot, EZ Poker,

Bet Manager, Real Link and the capability of operating at multiple properties. Therefore, these features are not approved for Washington.

Any modifications made to the G3 Progressive System must be submitted to us for additional testing and review. We reserve the right to investigate and reevaluate the G3 Progressive System if we determine that such a review is required to ensure compliance.
