

Big Slick / Bad Beat Blackjack

Big Slick / Bad Beat Blackjack combines two bonus options in regular blackjack. The player can make a bonus bet on either one of the bonus options, on both bonuses for the same hand, or may elect to make no bonus bet on the hand.

The bonus bets are independent and have different rules and pay tables listed below:

Big Slick Blackjack Rules

Big Slick Blackjack is a bonus bet to be played with regular blackjack.

Big Slick/ Bad Beat Blackjack is standard blackjack with an optional bonus wager. All rules pertaining to blackjack as posted on the WSGC website will remain the same and are not altered in this game except as noted in these rules of play.

The house can use 1, 2, or 6 decks of standard playing cards.

The player has an optional bonus wager that their first two cards will make a winning two-card poker hand. Winning hands would be; straights, pairs, straight flushes, and Ace – King (Big Slick) suited.

The card room may also offer the Bonus pay scale where if the player's first two cards are Ace and King suited and the Dealer's first two cards are Ace and King Suited, the Big Slick bonus bet pays 1000 to 1.

All other house blackjack rules apply.

Pay scales

Bonus Pay Scales (Players suited Ace King and Dealer's suited Ace King)

Rules for Bad Beat Blackjack

Bad Beat Blackjack (BBB) is an optional bonus bet for blackjack where the player gets paid if the player stands on a two-card 19 or 20 and is beaten by the dealer's hand, or if the player stands on a two-card 19, 20, or 21 and is pushed by the dealer's hand. Only initial two-card totals qualify; the player may not draw to a 19, 20, or 21 and still win a Bad Beat Blackjack wager.

Blackjack with dealer's Ace showing:

If the player has a blackjack and the dealer is showing an ace, the player has the option of taking even money or not. If the player takes even money, it is considered a win and the bonus wager pushes. If the player refuses even money and the dealer doesn't have a blackjack, the player is paid 3 to 2 on the basic bet and the bonus bet is a push. If the player refuses even money and the dealer has a blackjack, the basic bet is a push and the bonus bet is paid at 5 to 1.

All other house blackjack rules apply.

Authorized Bad Beat pay tables are listed below:

Payscale A

If player wins basic bet with a two-card hand count of 19, 20 or 21, the bonus bet is a push;

If player does not stand on a two-card hand count of 19, 20, or 21, the player loses the bonus bet;

<u>Player's hand</u>	<u>Result</u>	<u>Payoff</u>
20	Beaten	25 to 1
19	Beaten	15 to 1
21	Push	5 to 1
20	Push	5 to 1
19	Push	5 to 1

Payscale B

If player wins basic bet with a two-card hand count of 19, 20 or 21, or player does not stand on a two-card hand count of 19, 20, or 21, the player loses the bonus bet;

<u>Player's hand</u>	<u>Result</u>	<u>Payoff</u>
20	Beaten	35 to 1
19	Beaten	15 to 1
21	Push	8 to 1
20	Push	5 to 1
19	Push	5 to 1

Payouts are for any number of decks from 1 to 8.

Card room operators must not allow wagering limits to exceed the authorized limits set out in WAC 230-15-040 and WAC 230-15-140.
