## Introducing Two New Online Services For Employers of Representatives and Managers

We recently combined our various *individual renewal applications* that commercial businesses use into one. Now, all employees (card room employees, representatives and commercial gambling managers) will use the same application to renew their gambling license ([Form GC4-151](#)).

The renewal application is one page, front and back, and is unique to each employee. Because it is unique to each employee, employers no longer have the option to print blank renewal applications from our website. Instead, employers need to print renewal applications unique to each of their employees. This new service is located on our website under Online Services.

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## Poker Runs Must Be Licensed

Are you a charitable and nonprofit organization (charity) thinking about sponsoring a poker run, or a business owner who would like to be a stopping point/drawing station for a poker run? If so, you need to know the rules and licensing requirements for poker runs.

**What is a poker run?** A poker run is a raffle. Generally, raffle winners are drawn from a hat. However, for poker runs, winners are determined by participants' hand of cards at the end of the poker run. Selecting winners this way is known as an *alternative drawing format* ([WAC 230-11-055](#)).

Charities must have a raffle license to offer a poker run.

### How should poker runs be operated?

- The charity sells participants consecutively numbered tickets or poker tally sheets.
- Participants travel a predetermined course with predetermined drawing stations (typically five drawing stations).
- At each drawing station, participants draw one playing card for each ticket purchased. Station attendants must verify the card drawn and record the card value on the poker ticket tally sheet.
- After all participants have completed the course, the participant with the best recorded poker hand wins.



You are responsible for ensuring illegal gambling activities are not taking place at your business. Before allowing your business to be a drawing station, make sure the charity has a raffle license and they are operating the poker run correctly.

## Aggregate Limits For Multiple Odds-Based Wagers

Many house-banked card rooms offer games with multiple odds-based wagers. [WAC 230-15-490](#) allows card room operators to place limits on individual and/or the table payouts and explains how to calculate limits on odds-based wagers.

**Question:** Does the Gambling Commission require a separate player limit or table aggregate for each type of odds-based wager?

**Answer:** Yes, the limits referenced in [WAC 230-15-490](#) are for each odds based wager. If the game has multiple odds-based wagers, *each* odds-based wager would have its own prize limit.

For example, Six Card Poker has two odds-based wagers: Aces Up and the Bad Beat. If you want to limit the prize payout, you need to establish an individual player limit and table aggregate for each odds-based wager, such as:

### Aces Up

Individual player limit: \$5,000

Table aggregate: \$10,000

### Bad Beat

Individual player limit: \$5,000

Table aggregate: \$10,000

### Gambling Employee Renewal Application Reprint:

Employee renewal applications are sometimes misplaced or lost and employers need to request another one. For your convenience, we have created a new *Gambling Employee Renewal Application Reprint* Online Service for you to print renewal applications, unique to each of your licensed employees. To use this service, you must provide us a business e-mail address and get a password from us.

Please create an e-mail address that is named for your business, rather than a specific person, for example:

This way if you have staffing changes, you won't need to create a new e-mail account and get a new password.

Once we receive your e-mail address, we'll send you a password to access the *Gambling Employee Renewal Application Reprint* Online Service.

### Personnel Termination Notification:

For the past several years, card rooms have used a *Personnel Termination Notification* (PTN) Online Service to notify us when licensed employees leave their business.

The PTN Online Service is now available to employers of representatives and commercial gambling managers. You are invited to try it! We think you'll like it and find it convenient to instantly "unlink" an employee from your business.

## Proposed Rule Changes Under Review at the July 13, 2012, Commission Meeting

### Petition from the Public Up for Discussion and Possible Filing

#### Displaying Pull-Tab Merchandise Prizes WAC 230-14-095 Displaying prizes.

Pat Tompkins, Dynamic Pull Tabs, LLC, a licensed gambling service supplier, is requesting a rule change to allow pull-tab operators to post a description and photograph of pull-tab merchandise prizes, rather than the prize itself, due to security concerns, such as theft or accidental damage. The description and photograph would be displayed in plain view of or immediately adjacent to the pull-tab flare. This would include merchandise prizes that are small and can be displayed (no size constraints). The merchandise prizes would need to be stored on the premises and available for immediate viewing.

Currently, pull-tab operators must display merchandise prizes in plain view and in the immediate vicinity of a punch board or pull-tab game. However, there are three exceptions to this rule. Operators may:

- Wrap merchandise prizes for “surprise” games; or
- Display prizes elsewhere on the premises if size or space constraints do not allow it to be displayed in the immediate vicinity; and
- Use an accurate description or photograph of the prize in plain view on, or immediately adjacent to, the flare if prizes cannot be displayed on the premises. The intent is to address prizes, such as frozen food, that can’t be displayed in the immediate vicinity of the flare.

Mr. Tompkins is requesting an exception to allow operators to choose not to display prizes due to security concerns, such as theft or accidental damage.

At the February 2012 Commission meeting, a similar petition submitted by Mr. Tompkins was denied for lack of a motion, due to possible conflicts with RCW 9.46.110 (2)(d) which states:

“All merchandise prizes must be on *display* within the immediate area of the premises in which any such punchboard or pull-tab is located.”

### Petition from the Public Up for Final Action

#### Carryover Pots for House-Banked Card Games WAC 230-15-040 Requirements for authorized card games.

ShuffleMaster, a licensed manufacturer, is requesting approval to carryover pots in house-banked card games for up to ten games. Currently, players’ wins or losses must be determined during a single card game and pots cannot be carried over.

### Petition from the Public Up for Further Discussion

#### Connecting “Envy” and “Share the Wealth” “Bonus Features” at House-Banked Card Rooms WAC 230-15-040 Requirements for authorized card games. WAC 230-15-685 Restrictions on progressive jackpots.

Rockland Ridge, a licensed gambling service supplier, and Galaxy Gaming, a licensed manufacturer, are requesting approval to connect “envy” and “share the wealth” “bonus features” among different card games and different tables at a house-banked card room. A similar petition was denied at the February 2012 meeting due to regulatory and policy concerns. The petitioners submitted a new petition which was filed for further discussion at the April 2012 Commission meeting. The equipment the petitioners intend to use to facilitate their requested rule change will be tested by the Commission’s Electronic Gambling Lab to determine if it functions according to the proposed rule and/or if additional rule revisions are necessary. After this, the proposed rule change will be Up for Final Action.

### Staff Proposed Rule Change Up for Discussion and Possible Filing

#### Licensed *Members-Only* Raffles WAC 230-06-020 Restrictions on alcohol as prizes.

During the 2012 legislative session, SB6465 passed amending RCW 9.46.0315 to allow *members-only* raffles to exceed the \$5,000 yearly revenue limit, if the charitable/nonprofit organization (charity) obtains a raffle license. The law became effective June 7, 2012. In the past, charities were authorized to conduct an unlimited number of *members-only* raffles as long as the yearly gross revenue did not exceed \$5,000. A *members-only* raffle is the only time liquor (only unopened containers) can be given away as a prize for a gambling activity.



## Proposed Rule Changes Up for Discussion and Possible Filing August 2012 Commission Meeting

### Petition from the Public

#### Texas Hold'em Wager Increase

WAC 230-15-135 Wager limits for nonhouse-banked card games.

WAC 230-15-189 Repealer of House-banked and Class F card game licensee pilot program on wagering limits for Texas Hold'em poker.

The Recreational Gaming Association is requesting a rule change to increase Texas Hold'em wager limits from \$40 to \$100. This proposal comes after an 18 month pilot study which increased wager limits from \$40 to \$100 for Texas Hold'em poker. The pilot program began October 2010 and ended May 2012; however, the higher limits are in place until December 31, 2012, or until the Commission takes action (WAC 230-15-189).



The pilot study was used to:

- Test the regulatory and economic impacts of higher wager limits; and
- Help determine whether there was a demand for higher wagering limits for the game of Texas Hold'em poker.

Because the pilot study is over, the petition also includes a repealer for WAC 230-15-189.

### Staff Proposed Rule Change

#### Accessing Criminal History in Your License File

New rules outlining how licensees and applicants can access information in their gambling license file is needed to comply with RCW 10.97 and a new law that passed during the 2012 Session (ESB6296).

#### Electronic Raffle Systems

WAC 230-11-210 Leasing electronic raffle systems.

WAC 230-16-152 Remote access of electronic raffle systems.

A petition from 50/50 Central, formerly licensed as a manufacturer, requesting approval for raffle tickets to be sold using electronic raffle systems was filed for discussion at the November 2011 Commission meeting and discussed at the January 2012 Commission meeting. At their February 2012 meeting, the Commissioners voted to place the petition on hold until a manufacturer is licensed to offer the electronic raffle systems in Washington State. The petitioners submitted an application in June, which is under review. Watch for updates in future newsletters for when the Commissioners may take final action on the rules.

## NOVAS - Notice of Violation and Settlement

The Notice of Violation and Settlement (NOVAS) is a way to resolve some gambling rule violations without going through the full administrative process. A NOVAS is issued directly by a gambling field agent to a licensee at the time of the violation. The written notice outlines the violation and how to correct it. Fines range between \$200 and \$500.

If a licensee does not correct the violation and pay the fine within 15 days, we will take administrative action against their gambling license.
