NEW COMMISSIONER APPOINTED TO THE GAMBLING COMMISSION



Olympia, Washington: Governor Inslee recently appointed Detective Ed Troyer as a Commissioner to the Washington State Gambling Commission. He will attend his first Commission meeting in October 2014.

Commissioner Troyer has been with the Pierce County Sheriff's Department for over 30 years and is their Media Relations and Public Information Officer. He is also the Executive Director of Pierce County Crime Stoppers and Board Chair of TAPCO Credit Union.

Commissioner Troyer is a graduate of Tacoma Community College and is active in his community, volunteering for numerous nonprofit organizations and educational institutions.

The Gambling Commission is a law enforcement, regulatory and licensing agency that was created by the Legislature in 1973. Five citizens are appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Senate, to act as part-time Commissioners for a single six-year term. We anticipate Commissioner Troyer will have a confirmation hearing before the Senate during the 2015 Legislative Session.

The Gambling Commission typically meets once a month to discuss administrative issues, approve new gambling licenses, discuss and approve proposed rule changes, and take action regarding the revocation or suspension of gambling licenses. To learn more about what we do, visit www.wsgc.wa.gov.
