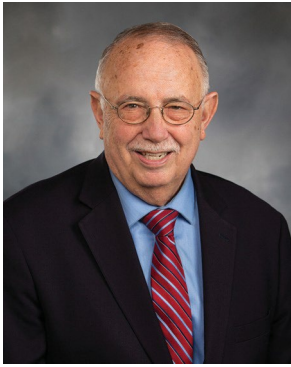

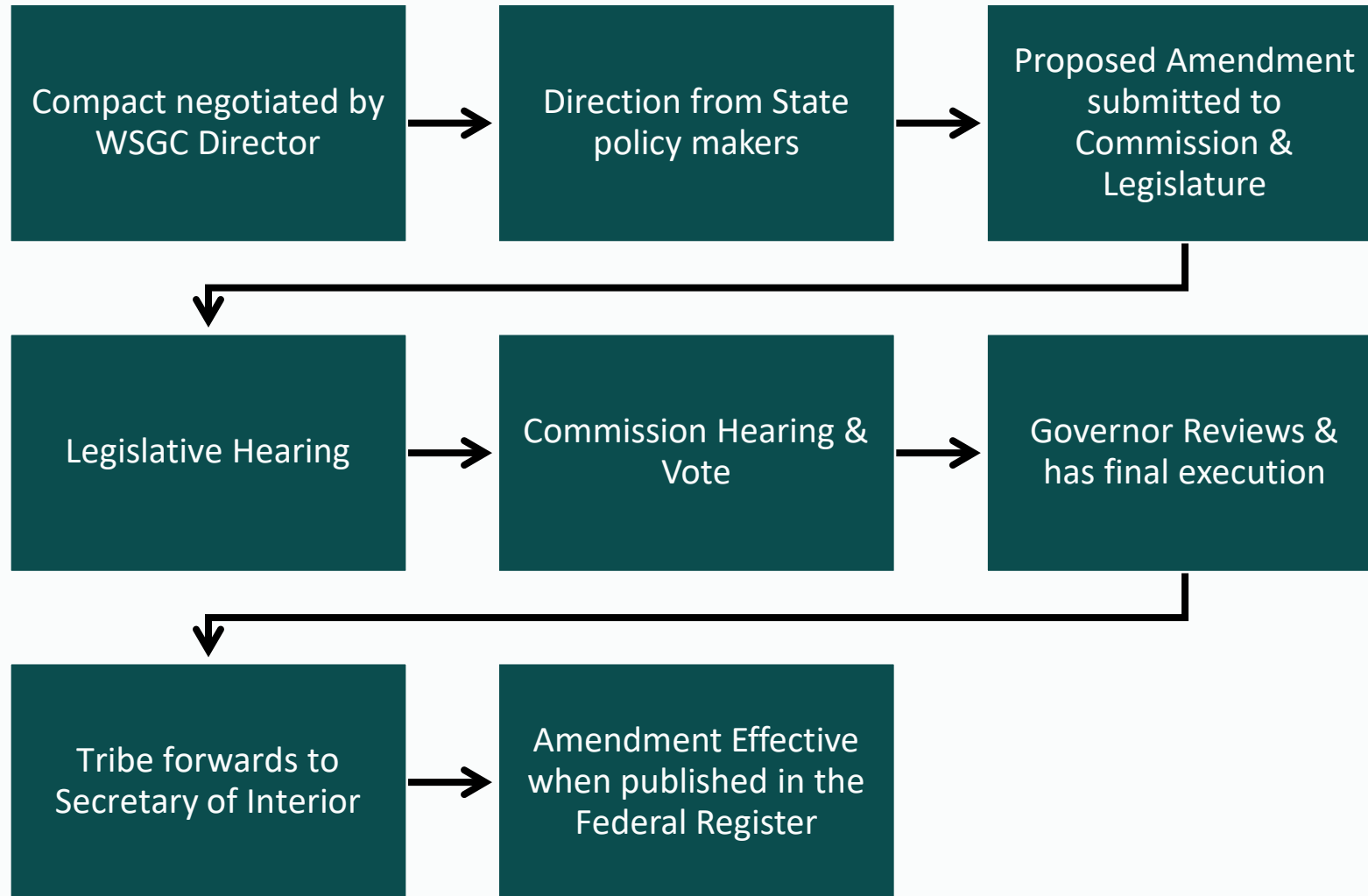

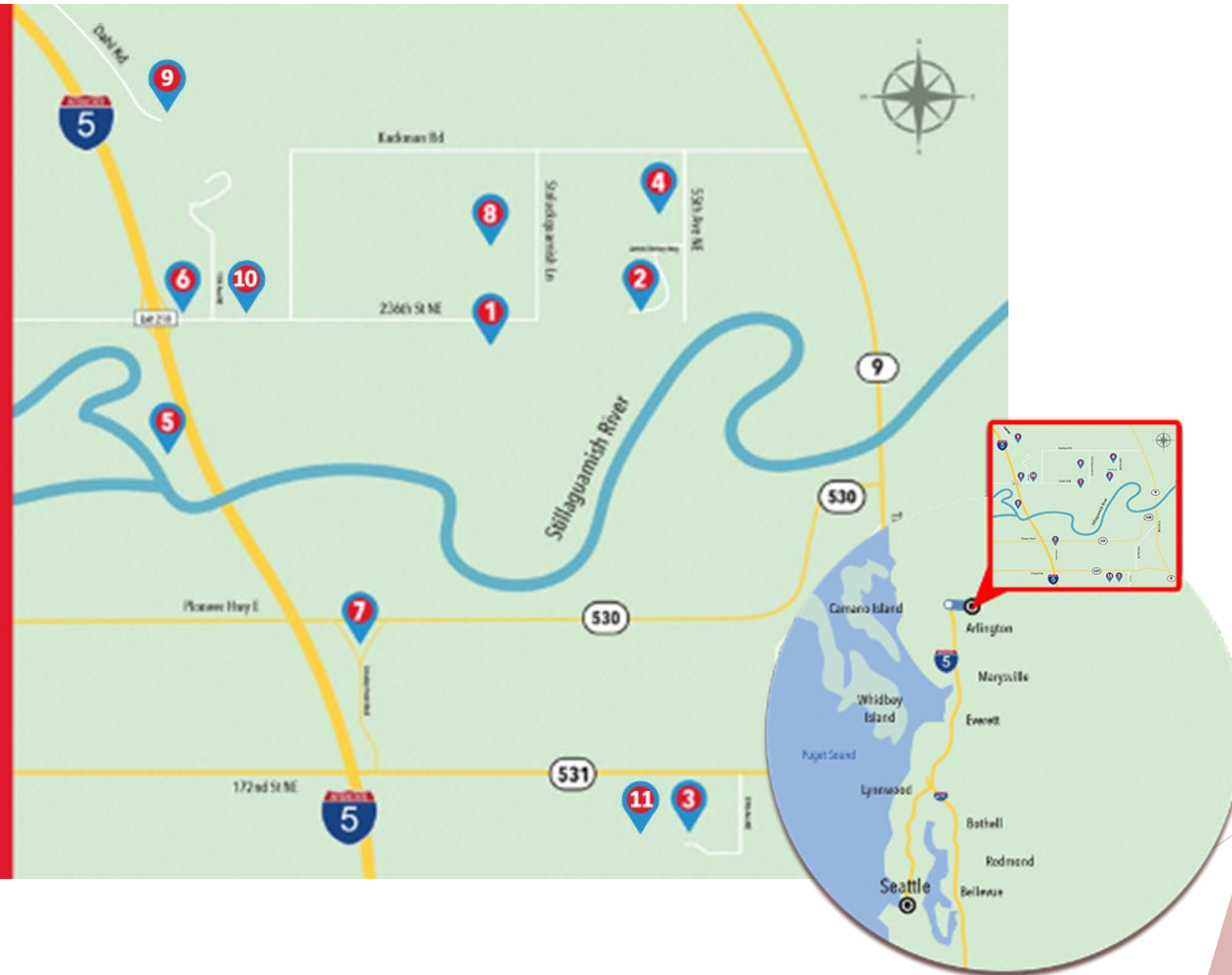

TRIBAL HISTORY

- ▶ Stuləg^wábš, English translation known as Stillaguamish
 - ▶ Refers to our people who lived along the Stillaguamish River and camped along its tributaries
- ▶ 1855 – The Tribe resided on Camano, the mouth and main stem of the Stillaguamish River, as well as the north and south forks
- ▶ 1855 – Treaty of Point Elliott
- ▶ October 27, 1976 – The Tribe received federal recognition
 - ▶ 1974 – Boldt Decision affirmed, recognized treaty rights, made eligible for federal services
- ▶ 2014 – The Tribe granted reservation from federal government
 - ▶ 64 acres in Snohomish County, WA near the Stillaguamish River

TRIBAL GOVERNMENT



- ▶ Stillaguamish Tribal Council
- ▶ Created in 1953 via the Tribe's constitution
- ▶ Six elected members
 - ▶ Chairman
 - ▶ Vice Chairman
 - ▶ Secretary
 - ▶ Treasurer
 - ▶ Two Non-Officer Members
- ▶ Providing services to assist every Tribal member

TRIBAL ADMINISTRATION



- ▶ Tribal Government, Outdoor Media, 210 Cannabis CO, and River Rock Fuel Stations employ a total of 330 Community & Tribal members
- ▶ Transportation Department
 - ▶ Provides transit services to the Tribal community
- ▶ Planning Department
 - ▶ Works on land use issues, utility management, road maintenance, grant writing

TRIBAL ADMINISTRATION



- ▶ Family Resources Department
 - ▶ Offers services to Tribal families
- ▶ Cultural Resources Department
 - ▶ Plans cultural events, preserves cultural sites, and keeps history
- ▶ Tribal Enrollment Department
- ▶ Police Department
 - ▶ Provides security and resources for the Tribal community and Tribal enterprises

TRIBAL ADMINISTRATION



- ▶ **Housing Department**
- ▶ In 2016 the Tribe, with its Tribal citizens, went through a series of hands-on interactive workshops to envision a new Stillaguamish Village. Based on the workshops, a final master site plan was developed. This project was fully Tribal funded without the use of grants. In addition to the 15 housing units created within the Stillaguamish Village, the Tribe has 49 additional scattered site homes that are fully Tribal funded and subsidized through Tribal hard dollars.
- ▶ **Canoe House-Carving Shed** – This building provides a space to engage in our canoe and carving practices. The Tribe’s carvers host classes such as tool making, canoe building, totem pole carvings, carving art. The canoe family gathers here for training and social events, as well as stores their canoes in this location.
- ▶ **Holistic Healing Center** – This building hosts the Tribe’s health practitioners, such as family practice doctors, mental health counselors, and massage therapists. This building also has a community room, which is open for community-based gatherings, such as weaving, cooking, and language classes.
- ▶ **Elders Campus** – The Elders Campus is comprised of six units: the elders longhouse, four elders cottages, and the elders park. These units are all ADA compliant, highly energy efficient, and come with a whole house generator to assist during power outages. The Tribe subsidizes elders’ rent through Tribal hard dollars.
- ▶ **Single Family Homes** – There are currently five single family homes that sit along a neighborhood park. Families that live in these units pay no more than 20% of their adjusted income on rent. The Tribe subsidizes rent through Tribal hard dollars.
- ▶ **Playground Park** – The playground includes elements that have been designed with a nice touch of nature play, including a log jam concept inspired by the traditional stick game that includes large slahal sticks made from logs. Our Tribal carvers built a beautiful dugout canoe as a play element. The park includes a public restroom.

STILLAGUAMISH HEALTH CLINIC



- ▶ Open to Stillaguamish Tribal members and their families, other enrolled Native Americans, and Tribal employees
- ▶ Massage Therapy Clinic
 - ▶ Restores clients' health and wellbeing through massage therapy and bodywork

QwəLÚT HEALING CENTER



- ▶ Assists the community to improve individual functioning and elevate the quality of life for all
- ▶ Behavioral Health Programs
 - ▶ Offers Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment and mental health services
 - ▶ Approximately 750 patients served in 2023
- ▶ Island Crossing Counseling Services
 - ▶ Assists the community to achieve a lifestyle of sobriety and health

COMMUNITY CENTER



- ▶ Located in the middle of the Tribal Housing Community
- ▶ Houses the Tribe's Daycare, part of the Cultural Department, Youth Services and Kitchen
- ▶ Youth Services
 - ▶ Goal is to make getting an education as accessible as possible
- ▶ Open and available to Stillaguamish citizens
- ▶ Cultural events, funerals, Summer Youth Program

NATURAL RESOURCES BUILDING



- ▶ Created in 1974 due to the Boldt Decision
- ▶ Manages, protects, and conserves the natural resources that are required to sustain healthy populations of fish, shellfish, and wildlife within the Stillaguamish Tribe's usual and accustomed areas (Stillaguamish watershed)

The Stillaguamish Tribe's Natural Resources Department focuses on protecting, enhancing, and restoring important treaty resources that are co-managed with other Treaty Tribes and the State of Washington. The Tribe's Natural Resources Department is home to 4 separate programs which include: Fisheries, Wildlife, Water Quality, and Environmental Restoration & Stewardship.

The work the Natural Resources Department is able to achieve through shared State and Tribal economic success and partnerships helps ensure greater climate resiliency and environmental stewardship for *all* Washingtonians.

Some key examples of this work includes:

Two Tribally Owned/Operated Hatcheries that produce ESA listed populations of Stillaguamish Chinook. The fish released from these hatcheries are genetically indistinct from their wild cohorts, and are produced solely to stave off extinction, while also serving as scientific indicators of where harvest impacts are hitting our salmon resources the hardest. Due to the co-management relationship between the Stillaguamish Tribe and state agencies like Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), we can responsibly manage salmon fisheries in Washington State, and work together to mitigate impacts on our stocks from northern fisheries in Canada and Alaska.

The Stillaguamish Tribe and WDFW have worked together over the past few years to invest over \$5.3 Million dollars in completing 318 acres of wetland connectivity work, opening up a combined total of 7.3 miles of tidal channels that will improve climate resiliency, and provide refuge and nursery habitat to ESA listed salmon populations in Port Susan Bay.

236TH ST NE SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS



Stillaguamish Tribe Completes 236th St NE Safety Improvements Project

- ▶ The Stillaguamish Tribe of Indians finished the 236th St NE Safety Improvements Project in September 2022. This project enhanced safety and environmental features along the roadway between 13th Ave NE and 35th Ave NE in Snohomish County.

- ▶ **Key improvements include:**
 - Wider shoulders and improved sight lines
 - Roundabout at the 19th Avenue intersection
 - Replaced fish barrier with a wildlife crossing
 - Raised roadway with new culverts for better water flow and animal passage
 - Stormwater management ponds
 - New sidewalks, curbs, and pavement markings

- ▶ Construction techniques minimized road closures, and detours were used when necessary. Access to homes and businesses remained open throughout the project.

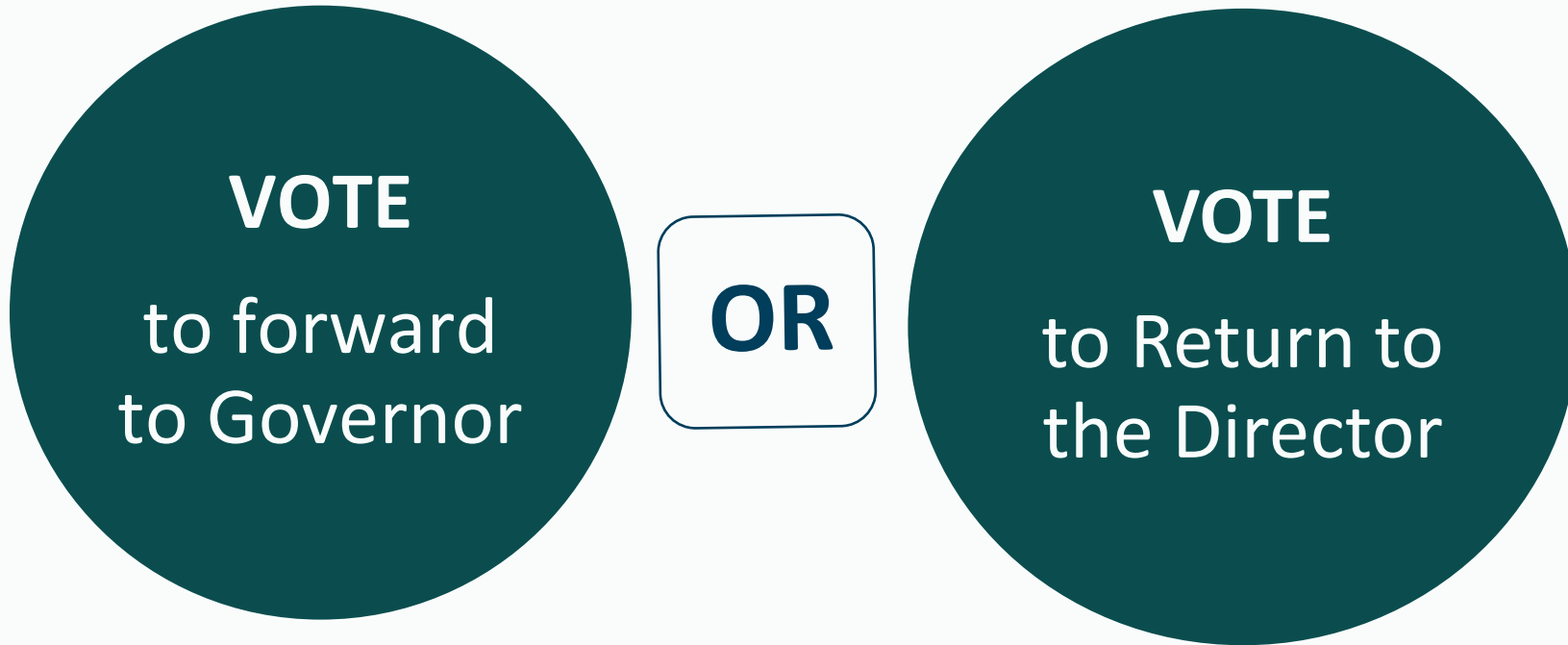

Chair Levy welcomed everyone to the Liquor and Cannabis Board and called the March meeting to order at 9:34 AM. She announced that the meeting would be recorded.

Tab 1 Consent Agenda

Chair Levy asked the Commissioners if they had any changes to the consent agenda. She asked commissioners if they had any questions. There were none. She asked for public comment. There was none.

Commissioner Ibsen moved to approve the consent agenda as presented by staff.

Commissioner Patterson seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously. 4:0

Commissioner Lawson was not present at the time of the vote.

Tab 2 Presentation – Problem Gambling Awareness Month

Tina Griffin, Director, began the presentation with a brief Directors' report. She Announced that March is Problem Gambling Awareness Month and that the Disordered Gambling Advisory Workgroup (DGAW) met recently. The group talked about the GRIT Act. They received an update that it would most likely not pass this Legislative Session, but the National Council on Problem Gambling has a dedicated page on their website to the GRIT Act. She told commissioners if they wanted to add a letter of support to that website moving forward, let her know. Commissioner Patterson asked Representative Robertson to consider passing a resolution supporting the GRIT Act. He agreed. She would also like to ask Senator Conway to mirror Representative Robertson's efforts.

Tina Griffin, Director; introduced Tana Russell, Deputy Director Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling and Roxane Waldron MPA, Health Care Authority to present their presentations.

Commissioner Lawson joined the meeting.

Tab 3 – Legislative Update

Tina Griffin, Director, presented the materials for this tab. Director Griffin gave a brief summary of the bills that we tracked this session. She announced that the animal cruelty bill that Commissioners chose to support passed. Director Griffin also mentioned that at the May commission meeting staff will be bringing topics for potential agency request legislation discussion for consideration for the 2025 Legislative Session.

Chair Levy asked for public comments. There was no public comment.

Tab 4 – Rules up for Final Action – Non-Profit Raffle Rules

Adam Amorine, Staff Attorney, and Interim Rules Coordinator (RC) presented the materials for this tab.

Chair Levy asked Commissioners if they had any comments. They did not. She asked for public comments. There was none.

Commissioner Sizemore moved to take final action on the proposed final rules as presented by staff.

Commissioner Ibsen seconded the motion.

The motion passed. 4:0

Commissioner Lawson abstained.

Tab 5 – Rules Up for Final Action – Adjacent Card rooms

Adam Amorine, Staff Attorney, and Interim Rules Coordinator (RC) presented the materials for this tab. This rule will be back on the May agenda.

Chair Levy asked Commissioners if they had any comments. They did not. She asked for public comments. There was none.

Commissioner Patterson moved to further amend WAC 230-03-182 for further discussion and strike the last sentence of subsection 2, which states, “The provisions of subsection (1) of this section will take effect upon the issuance of a new license.”

Commissioner Sizemore seconded the motion.

The motion passed. 5:0

Commissioners took a 10-minute break.

Tab 6 – Rules up for Discussion and Possible Filing – Problem Gambling Signage

Adam Amorine, Staff Attorney, and Interim Rules Coordinator (RC) presented the materials for this tab. Commissioner Patterson thanked staff for their hard work.

Chair Levy asked Commissioners if they had any questions. They did not. She asked for Public Comment. There were none.

Commissioner Patterson moved to file the proposed rules for further discussion as presented by staff.

Commissioner Anders seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously. 5:0

Tab 7 – Staff Request to Initiate Rule Making – Minimum Cash on Hand

Adam Amorine, Staff Attorney, and Interim Rules Coordinator (RC) presented the materials for this tab. In developing new rules for minimum cash on hand requirements, staff is weighing the concerns that were originally articulated by the petitioners along with staff's concerns and really the public's concerns that all winning prizes are paid out in full and in a timely manner. Staff still do have some concerns in generating this language, but at the same time we are ready to recommend rulemaking to amend the WAC and create new rules related to how prizes can be paid.

Chair Levy asked Commissioners if they had any questions. **Commissioner Sizemore** asked if staff's concerns were because the players are being paid out in cash? **RC Amorine** stated that the staff's interest wasn't that the players are paid out in cash at the time of the win, it was more that they are interested in making sure that they are paid fully.

Chair Levy asked for Public Comment.

Eric Persson, Owner of Maverick Gaming. Mr. Persson gave public testimony to express his concerns over the minimum cash on hand rule. His primary concerns are about consumer confidence and public safety.

Chair Levy asked for any further comments from Commissioners. There were none.

Commissioner Patterson moved to initiate rulemaking proceedings for further discussion.

Commissioner Sizemore seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously. 5:0

Chair Levy announced at 11:04 AM Commissioners would adjourn to Executive Session to discuss current and potential agency litigation with legal counsel, including tribal negotiations for approximately two and a half hours.

Chair Levy asked for public comment. There was none.

Chair Levy announced that the next commission meeting would be held at the Gambling Commission headquarters on April 25th.

Updating the Problem Gambling Signage

We've begun working with the Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling (ECPG), the State Problem Gambling Program, the Horse Racing Commission, and the Lottery Commission to update the informational signs licensees are required to post per RCW 9.46.071.

It has been many years since we've updated these signs. The plan is:

- For ECPG to provide the signage information, to include the toll-free helpline number and a QR code for a direct link to resources;
- To print new signs and have all licensees replace existing signage; and
- To provide the same or similar resource information and links as included in the signage on our website.

Indian Gaming Association Tradeshow

On April 10 and 11, 2024, Commissioner Lawson, myself, and three other staff attended the Indian Gaming Association Tradeshow in Anaheim, CA.

Over the course of a day and a half, we visited with over 12 vendors who provide gambling equipment or services. Many of the vendors were licensees. The vendors demonstrated their new products for us, and we answered their questions regarding approval processes, rules, laws, licensing, etc.

A new feature of the tradeshow was panel discussions on current trends and topics, such as cashless systems.

The Indian Gaming Mid-Year Conference and Expo will be at the Tulalip Resort Casino September 16 – 18, 2024.

Update on Modernizing our IT Legacy Systems

We've just about completed our business requirement gathering, phase 1. Our next phase is to procure the services of a Quality Assurance (QA) provider and conduct a readiness assessment. The readiness assessment is a state requirement that must be done per the OCIO prior to contracting for the procurement of a system solution.

The Readiness Assessment evaluates such things as the agency's readiness for the project, engagement and communication strategy to internal and external stakeholders, organizational change management, acquisition planning, and sufficiency and commitment of project resources, such as critical subject matter experts, over the life of the project.

Procurement of the QA was longer than initially planned because of a new contracting process by the Department of Enterprise Services. To make the most use of the approximately 6 to 8 weeks it will take for the QA to complete their assessment, we will be reviewing potential product solutions by the vendors on the state contract list. This will help us determine if we can find a possible solution from the approved vendor list. The alternative is to issue a Request for Proposal, which would add at least 4 – 8 weeks to the project timeline.

Procuring and Implementing a New Records Management System

A separate and necessary project we are currently undertaking is to acquire and implement a records management system (RMS).

In mid-April, we procured the system. Soon we will begin the 6-to-8-month journey of converting our records to the new RMS. The records to be converted include those from our legacy IT systems, license files, electronic files, and other business and regulatory records. We hope to mitigate staff time needed for conversion and implementation by getting outside help to scan records into the new RMS since this project overlaps with modernizing our IT legacy systems.

<p>BOLD = Changes made since January 2024 Commission Meeting</p> <p>RCW 9.46.070(5) requires the Commission to set fees to generate funds necessary to cover all costs of regulation, licensing, and enforcement.</p> <p>In 2023, the Commission adjusted license fees for charitable and nonprofit organizations, commercial stimulant organizations, and for other businesses. The changes were made to ensure the Commission was collecting revenue to support increasing expenditures with no staff increases, i.e., salaries and benefits, supplies and equipment, and government services from agencies such as the Attorney General’s Office and Department of Enterprise Services.</p> <p>In determining the proposed fee change for the 2023-2025 biennium, Commission staff presented an adjusted proposal based on revenue needs for the first year of the biennium (FY24) only in an effort to reduce the amount of the fee increase. This was done with the expectation that we may have to return in a year to revisit fees because it was estimated the revenue increase would not be enough to fully cover the increased costs and that we would be relying on our available fund balance to offset the difference.</p> <p>Five months of revenue and expenditure data with the fee changes show we are not collecting enough revenue to cover all costs of regulation, licensing, and enforcement. Reviewing current anticipated expenditures and the Governor's supplemental budget proposal indicates expenditures will continue to increase.</p> <p>Relying on our excess fund balance to cover increasing expenses is not sustainable. These increasing expenses include an indeterminate ongoing cost for software licensing that is the result of our project to replace our legacy IT systems, which we anticipate being completed in FY25. We have issued a Request for Information (RFI) to the vendor community; estimated ongoing costs are a part of that request. Responses to our RFI are due January 15, 2024.</p> <p>We will not be making any changes to the sports wagering vendor license fees.</p> <p>At the January 2024 commission meeting, Commissioners initiated rulemaking to explore adjusting license fees.</p> <p>Following a budget presentation at the February 2024 commission meeting, Commissioners expressed their concerns about reacting to quickly and wanted to see the first quarter 2024 quarterly license fees, which would be presented at the May 2024 commission meeting.</p>	

Policy Considerations

The current license fees may not be sufficient to cover the agency's costs of licensing, regulation, and enforcement beginning in fiscal year 2025.

Stakeholder and Tribal Partner Feedback

Prior to the January 2024 commission meeting, staff shared with tribal partners and stakeholders concerns of the decline in license fee revenue and sought their input and suggestions.

Prior to the May 2024 commission meeting, staff shared with tribal partners and stakeholders the first quarter 2024 quarterly license fee revenue received.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends discussing how to proceed with rulemaking to address license fee increases to cover the costs of licensing, regulation, and enforcement based on the first quarter 2024 quarterly license fees and fiscal year to date expenditures.

At the April 2023 Commission meeting, Commissioners initiated rule making on problem gambling signage other. After reviewing the rules of 18 states and two Canadian provinces, staff prepared the attached rule language that, if adopted, would become part of the Commission’s rule chapter that applies to all licensees.

This rulemaking aims to address problem gambling by:

- Requiring licensees to display problem gambling signage at all public entrances and exits to the gambling area of the business; in or near the gambling area(s); and in any areas where cash or electronic transfers of funds are available to patrons within the designated gambling area.
- Requiring all advertising materials to contain a responsible gambling message.
- Requiring all advertising, marketing, or promotional materials to include a clear “opt-out” method that would allow patrons to unsubscribe from future advertising, marketing, or promotional communications.

In January and February 2024, staff sought feedback on the proposed rule language from:

- Roxane Waldron, Program Manager of the state’s Problem Gambling program within the Health Care Authority,
- Maureen Greeley, Director of the Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling, and
- All licensees, except sport wagering vendors and individuals.

To ensure our tribal partners are informed of agency rule making, we will be providing new rule notices and information on feedback sessions for all rules being considered by the Commission.

At the March 2024 meeting, Commissioners filed the proposed rule language for further discussion.

Policy Considerations

As the Commission considers staff-proposed language for a new rule on problem gambling signage, Commissioners may want to keep in mind the provisions already contained in statute:

- RCW 9.46.071(b): The Washington state gambling commission, the Washington horse racing commission, and the state lottery commission shall jointly develop problem gambling and gambling disorder informational signs, which include a toll-free hotline number for individuals with a gambling problem or gambling disorder. The signs shall be placed in the establishments of gambling licensees, horse racing licensees, and lottery retailers.
- RCW 9.46.072: An entity licensed under RCW 9.46.070(1) which conducts or allows its premises to be used for conducting bingo on more than three occasions per week shall include the following statement in any advertising or promotion of gambling activity conducted by the licensee: "CAUTION: Participation in gambling activity may result in pathological gambling behavior causing emotional and financial harm. For help, call 1-800-547-6133." For purposes of this section, "advertising" includes print media, point-of-sale advertising, electronic media, billboards, and radio advertising.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Commission take final action on WAC 230-06-068 after holding a public hearing with an effective date of 31 days after filing with the Office of the Code Reviser.

NEW SECTION

WAC 230-06-068 Problem gambling signage and posting requirements. (1) The commission will provide licensees with problem gambling, gambling disorder, and responsible gambling informational signs, which include a responsible gambling message and a toll-free helpline number for problem gambling and gambling disorders. The signs must be conspicuously posted: At all public entrances and exits to the gambling area of the business; in or near the gambling area(s); and in any areas where cash or electronic transfers of funds are available to patrons within the designated gambling area.

(2) All advertising materials must contain a responsible gambling message.

(a) Advertising is any notice or communication to the public of any information concerning the gambling-related business of the licensee through broadcasting, publication, or any other means of dissemination.

(b) For bingo licensees conducting bingo on more than three occasions per week, advertisements must follow RCW 9.46.072.

(c) The responsible gambling message must include, at a minimum, the statement "play responsibly" or similar language and the toll-free telephone helpline number for problem gambling and gambling disorders. Provided, an alternative to the responsible gambling message would be to contain the words "If you or someone you know has been harmed by gambling and wants help, call 1-800-GAMBLER."

(3) All direct advertising, marketing, or promotional materials must include a clear and conspicuous method allowing patrons to unsubscribe from future advertising, marketing, or promotional communications.

(4) This rule does not apply to major, mid-level, or ancillary sports wagering vendors.

Staff suggests amendment of WAC 230-06-046, or the creation of a new rule, related to additional requirements for licensed business premises of nonhouse-banked, Class F, and house-banked card rooms. The rule currently establishes conditions under which card rooms cannot be adjacent to each other. Staff believes that there is a need to further clarify under which limited conditions nonhouse-banked, Class F, and house-banked card rooms can be adjacent to each other.

Staff developed clarifying language to ensure that adjacent card rooms operate as separate and distinct licensed business premises. Staff also determined that this rule is more appropriately located in Chapter 230-03, which relates to pre-licensing procedures, rather than in Chapter 230-06 detailing rules for all licenses. To accomplish this movement between chapters, the Commission needs to adopt a new rule in Chapter 230-03, which is a revised version of the old rule. The old rule would then be repealed on an expedited basis as redundant. Attached is the current WAC 230-06-046, the proposed new rule (WAC 230-03-182), and the filing for a repeal of WAC 230-06-046.

At the January 2024 commission meeting, Commissioners:

- Authorized staff to initiate rulemaking on an expedited basis for repeal of WAC 230-06-046 once the new WAC 230-03-182 became effective and
- Filed WAC 230-03-182 for further discussion with additional language to subsection 3 to further identify adjacent cardrooms licensed as of July 1, 2018, are not bound by the requirements.

At the March 2024 commission meeting, Commissioners:

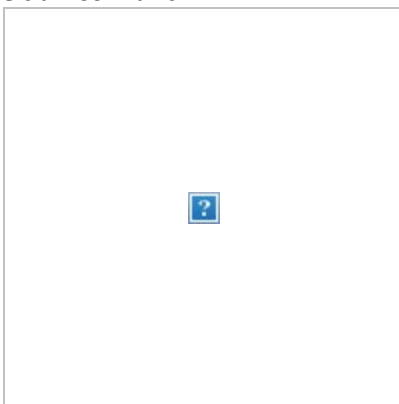
Thanks for the robust conversation during the commission meeting last week. We appreciate the willingness to clarify the issues surrounding this rule.

Commented [JB2]: This language is from the existing rule - which prohibits adjacent locations from having certain features - however, the new rule, rather than prohibiting features, requires that adjacent locations have certain features. This change clarifies that difference - otherwise - as written, existing licensed adjacent card rooms would not be grandfathered unless they "have any of the features listed in subsection (1)".

Commented [JB3]: It is unclear what the intent of this is because the provisions of subsection (1) would be effective upon the effective date of the rule - so including an additional section that triggers the effectiveness of the requirements on the issuance of a new license is confusing.

<p>The Washington State Gambling Commission has been working to replace the current legacy IT systems since March 2023 in an effort to modernize technology. As we approach implementation of the new IT systems, commission staff has identified several chapters of WAC Title 230 that will need to be updated. These rule changes will correspond to the new capabilities of the new IT system and allow for more efficient processes for staff, licensees, and applicants. <p>RCW 9.46.070(1) – (4) authorizes the Commission to issue licenses for a period not to exceed one year to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization, • an organization operating a business primarily engaged in the selling of food or drink for consumption on the premises, • an organization operating or conducting amusement games, and • organizations engaged in the manufacturing, selling, distributing, or supplying of devices, equipment, software, hardware, or any gambling related service set fees to generate funds necessary to cover all costs of regulation, licensing, and enforcement. <p>Currently, organizational licenses expire at the end of a quarter, depending on when their license was initially approved. In June 2023, the Commission adjusted annual license fees for charitable and nonprofit organizations, commercial stimulant organizations, and for other businesses. This was the first time the license fees had been adjusted since being implemented in 2018. Licensees began paying the adjusted license fees when they renewed their license.</p> <p>Because of the quarterly expiration of organizational licenses, it took nine months before all organizational licensees began paying the adjusted license fees. More importantly, it currently takes 13 months from the implementation of the rule change for all licensees to be subject to the adjusted Gross Gambling Receipts Rate and 22 months (April 30, 2025) to receive a full year of revenue from the adjusted rates. This makes it extremely challenging to forecast cash flow and collect adjusted license fees in a timely manner.</p> <p>Staff are proposing that we initiate rulemaking to align all organizational license expiration dates to June 30th. This will aid in revenue forecasting as well as simplify implementation and communication to licensees when adjusting license fees in the future.</p> <p>Rulemaking would take the form of amending existing rules and/or adding additional rules to WAC chapters 230-03, 230-05, and/or 230-06.</p>

Background

At the November 2023 Commission meeting, Commissioners asked staff to work with stakeholders to determine if rulemaking could address recent stakeholder concerns regarding the minimum cash on hand requirements for house-banked card rooms.

Currently, our rules require house-banked card game licensees to have sufficient cash on hand to redeem all chips issued for play and pay out all prizes. Failure to keep funds to cash in chips, pay prizes, or redeem gambling related checks is prima facie evidence of fraud (WAC 230-15-050).

To ensure that house-banked card game licensees have sufficient cash on hand to redeem all chips for play and pay out all prizes, we require, by rule, house-banked card rooms to have a minimum amount of cash on hand based on a formula:

- At least \$1,000 for each house-banked table on the gambling floor, plus
- The amount of the largest single prize available, excluding progressive, player-supported, and house jackpot prizes.

Staff has found that the formula to calculate “sufficient cash on hand to redeem all chips issued for play and pay out all prizes” may not be adequate for all house-banked card game licensees. Rulemaking is needed to address staff’s concerns as follows:

- Some house-banked card rooms have had difficulty cashing out players’ chips at the cashier’s cage even though they met our minimum cash on hand requirements. These were cases where a player did not win a large prize, but were rather cashing out a large amount of chips from winning multiple smaller hands.
- It is rare for players to win large prizes in the tens of thousands of dollars at house-banked card rooms. Rather, general day to day operations in house-banked card rooms involves multiple players purchasing chips at tables and then redeeming chips at the cashier’s cage. Card rooms generally maintain cash in the cashier’s cage based on the volume of gambling in their facility, not based on the potential for someone to win a rare large prize.
- Consistency with other states. Other states minimum cash on hand requirements are based on volume of gambling, rather than a single large prize that may or may not be won. For example, the Nevada Gaming Control Board’s calculation for minimum cash on hand is a per table requirement plus 1% of gross gaming revenue (volume) from the last fiscal year. The National Indian Gaming Commission has the same calculation as Nevada for minimum cash on hand.
- In 2023, wager limits were increased from \$300 to \$400. Players are now able to buy more chips for play, and in turn, card rooms may have to redeem more chips at the cashier’s cage. The minimum cash on hand formula should address this potential greater influx of gaming.

- The “*largest single prize*” offered by almost every card room in the state is an odds-based prize that has an aggregate payout limit attached to it according to WAC 230-15-490. For example, a card room that offers a game that has 8000-1 odds and \$400 wagering limits can limit the prize to \$20,000 according to WAC 230-15-490. The \$20,000 aggregated prize becomes the “*largest single prize*” according to the formula in WAC 230-15-050. This was the same “*largest single prize*” amount in 2008 when the wagering limits were only \$200.

Staff has also found that rules only allow house-banked card game licensees to write checks for progressive jackpots, player supported jackpots, and house jackpots. Current rules do not specifically authorize checks to be written for large odds-based and fixed-based prizes (e.g. the prizes in Masque’s card game).

At the March 2024 commission meeting, Commissioners authorized initial rulemaking to amend WAC 230-15-050 and create new rules.

The proposed rules:

- Require card game licensees to exchange chips for cash unless the player requests payment by check;
- Changes the formula for determining the minimum amount of cash required to be in the cage, safe, and/or vault for house-banked card rooms;
- Allows for specific prizes to be paid by check; and
- Require house-banked card room licensees to have sufficient funds to pay fixed-based prizes offered.

Public Feedback

Eric Persson, owner of Maverick Gaming, spoke at the March 14, 2024, commission meeting. Mr. Persson expressed his concern regarding potential safety risks associated with staff members and winning players handling a large amount of cash.

Commission staff held a public feedback session on April 16, 2024, where several individuals expressed support for changes to minimum cash on hand requirements due to potential safety risks that a large amount of cash may present to both cardroom staff and the players.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends filing the attached rule language for further discussion.

WAC 230-15-050 Minimum cash on hand requirements. (1)

Card game licensees must have sufficient cash on hand to redeem all chips issued for play and pay out all prizes.

(2) Within three hours of opening for the business day, at a time included in the internal controls, house-banked card game licensees must have at least the following minimum amount of cash on premises in their cage, safe, and vault combined:

(a) One thousand dollars for each house-banked table on the gambling floor; plus

(b) The amount of the largest single prize available excluding progressive jackpot, player-supported jackpot, and house jackpot prizes.

For example: If a house-banked card room has 15 house-banked tables and a largest single prize of \$23,000, before opening, the cage must have at least \$38,000 on hand: 15 tables x \$1,000 = \$15,000 + largest single prize of \$23,000 = \$38,000.

(3) Except for the restrictions on player-supported jackpot pay outs in WAC 230-15-405 and progressive jackpot pay outs in

WAC 230-15-690, licensees may pay prizes by check if sufficient funds are available on deposit.

(4) Failure to keep funds to cash in chips, pay prizes, or redeem gambling related checks is prima facie evidence of fraud. Meeting the minimum cage cash amount does not relieve the licensee from the requirement to have sufficient funds available to redeem all chips and pay out all prizes.

WAC 230-15-050 Minimum cash on hand requirements. (1) Card game licensees must have sufficient cash on hand to redeem all chips issued for play ~~((and pay out all prizes))~~. Licensees must exchange chips brought to the cashier's cage by players for cash; however, the licensee may write a check for the balance of chips redeemed, but only at the request of the player. Licensees must issue the check within 24 hours.

(2) Within three hours of opening for the business day, at a time included in the internal controls, house-banked card game licensees must have at least the following minimum amount of cash on premises in their cage, safe, and/or vault combined:

(a) ~~((One))~~ Two thousand dollars for each house-banked table on the gambling floor; plus

(b) ~~((The amount of the largest single prize available excluding progressive jackpot, player-supported jackpot, and house jackpot prizes.))~~ One percent times card room gross gambling receipts from the previous calendar year according to quarterly license reports submitted to the commission; however, a new house-banked card room who has not yet submitted a full calendar year of quarterly license reports must have at least \$30,000 for the purpose of this subsection.

For example: If a house-banked card room has 15 house-banked tables and ~~((a largest single prize of \$23,000, before opening, the cage))~~ their gross receipts were \$4,000,000 in their previous calendar year, they must have at least $((\$38,000))$ \$70,000 cash on hand: 15 tables \times $((\$1,000))$ \$2,000 = $((\$15,000))$ \$30,000 + $((largest single prize of $23,000 = $38,000))$ $1\% \times \$4,000,000 = \$40,000$.

(3) ~~((Except for the restrictions on player-supported jackpot pay outs in WAC 230-15-405 and progressive jackpot pay outs in WAC 230-15-690,))~~ Licensees may pay specific prizes by check if sufficient funds are available on deposit and they meet the restrictions in the rules below:

(a) WAC 230-15-405 - Player-supported jackpot prizes.

(b) WAC 230-15-690 - Progressive jackpot prizes.

(c) WAC 230-15-673 - House jackpot prizes.

(d) WAC 230-15-190 - Odds-based and fixed-based prizes.

(4) Failure to keep funds to cash in chips, pay prizes, or redeem gambling related checks is prima facie evidence of fraud. Meeting the minimum cage cash amount does not relieve the licensee from the requirement to have sufficient funds available to redeem all chips and pay out all prizes.

NEW SECTION

WAC 230-15-186 Paying out odds-based and fixed-based prizes.

(1) House-banked card room licensees must immediately pay out all individual odds-based and fixed-based prizes of \$5,000 or less.

(2) For individual odds-based and fixed-based prizes over \$5,000, licensees must immediately pay out a minimum of \$5,000 and pay the remaining balance within 24 hours by check. The player may request that the licensee pay up to the entire prize balance by check. Licensees must then issue a check for the entire prize balance within 24 hours.

NEW SECTION

WAC 230-15-187 Keeping funds to pay fixed-based prizes.

House-banked card room licensees must not offer a fixed-based prize to be won by a player if they do not have sufficient funds to pay the prize. Licensees must maintain at least the amount of the single largest fixed-based prize offered in a bank, mutual savings bank, or credit union located in Washington. Alternatively, licensees may maintain the amount of the single largest fixed-based prize in cash on the licensed premises.

Washington State Gambling Commissioners

Background

At the commission meeting on November 16, 2023, Commissioner Julia Patterson requested that the Gambling Commission evaluate WAC 230-06-025 (restrictions on firearms as prizes) to ensure the rule is in accordance with SHB 1240 (prohibiting manufacturing, importing, distributing, or selling assault weapons). Commissioners expressed concern that nonprofit and charitable organizations in Washington are able to award assault weapons as raffle prizes, which may conflict with SHB 1240 aiming to prevent the selling and manufacture of assault weapons in the State.

Commissioners had further discussion on the topic at the January and February 2024 commission meetings.

At the February 2024 meeting, Commissioners agreed to initiate rulemaking to change WAC 230-06-026 to ensure the law is in line with other state statutes and bring it more in line with how these raffles are actually being conducted in Washington State:

- Limit the certificate to be redeemable by a licensed firearm dealer to a Washington State dealer.
- Limit the firearms that are available as prizes to only those firearms that are authorized for sale in Washington State. Amended language would clarify this point.
- Prohibit persons who are not permitted to own firearms in Washington from winning a firearm in a raffle. Additional language to the rule is needed to ensure such prohibited individuals are not able to acquire a firearm as a raffle prize.

WAC 230-06-025 Restrictions on firearms as prizes. Only charitable or nonprofit organizations operating a raffle may award firearms, air guns, or other mechanical devices which are capable of discharging dangerous projectiles, including but not limited to, BB or CO₂ guns, rifles, shotguns, pistols or revolvers, or crossbows as a prize. If the prize awarded is restricted from transfer by state or federal law, the licensee must award the winner a certificate, redeemable by a licensed firearms dealer, for the prize offered.

WAC 230-06-025 Restrictions on firearms as prizes. Only

charitable or nonprofit organizations operating a raffle may award firearms, air guns, or other mechanical devices which are capable of discharging dangerous projectiles, including but not limited to, BB or CO₂ guns, rifles, shotguns, pistols or revolvers, or crossbows as a prize. The firearm must be authorized for sale in Washington State. If the prize awarded is restricted from transfer by state or federal law, the licensee must award the winner a certificate, redeemable by a licensed Washington State firearms dealer, for the prize offered. Alternatively, the winner shall be awarded a prize of equivalent value, such as a gift certificate, if the winner of the raffle is prohibited from owning or possessing firearms by other sections of the RCW.

SUBJECT: POTENTIAL 2025 AGENCY REQUEST LEGISLATION MEMO

While the 2024 legislative session recently concluded, we must begin to prepare for the 2025 legislative session. Below is a timeline if the agency has legislation it would like to move forward in 2025:

<u>Date</u>	<u>Action</u>
May 9	Discuss possible agency request legislation topics during public meeting.
June 3	Feedback meeting with tribal partners and public to share possible agency request legislation topics.
July 11 and 12	During public meeting Commissioners determine what agency request legislative topics staff will prepare to submit to the Governor based on feedback from tribal partners and the public feedback session.
August 8 and 9	During public meeting Commissioners provide feedback on draft language and packet materials for proposed agency request legislation.
September 12 and 13	During public meeting Commissioners vote on agency request legislation materials to send to Governor for approval.

Some topics we are considering for 2025 agency request legislation include changes to:

- RCW 9.46 Gambling Act
- RCW 42.56 Public Records Act
- RCW 49.44.240 Discrimination based on cannabis use – Exceptions

At the May commission meeting, we'll share more information about the specific changes and gather the Commissioner's thoughts on potential legislative changes for 2025.
