


I. HISTORY OF THE NISQUALLY INDIAN TRIBE



- The Nisqually Indian Tribe has lived in the Puget Sound watershed since time immemorial
- Our original homeland had about 2 million acres that stretched from Mt. Rainier, along the watershed, to the Puget Sound
- We have always been a fishing people. Salmon not only serves as the mainstay of our diet, but also as the foundation of our culture



- The Medicine Creek Treaty of 1854 established a 1,280 acre Reservation in an undesirable rocky location away from the Nisqually River
- In 1856, an executive order enlarged the Reservation to about 4,700 acres
- In the winter of 1917, the U.S. Army ordered us from our homes without warning
- Pierce County then condemned about 3,300 acres of the Reservation and transferred it to the Army to expand Ft. Lewis



- Today, 3,300 acres of Nisqually Reservation lands remain part of Ft. Lewis, and are shown in orange to the east of the River
- The remaining 1,700 acres, which lies west of the River, is in a combination of Tribal ownership, individual Indian ownership and non-Indian ownership

II. HISTORY OF NISQUALLY GAMING





- The Nisqually Bingo Hall opened in 1992
- It set the stage for the opening of the Red Wind Casino in 1997



- Since opening in 1997, the Casino has expanded 3 times, including the 2015 expansion, which added a new two-story, 40,000 square foot wing
- Today, Red Wind has over 1,700 slots, 22 table games, Keno and dining amenities

III. GAMING REVENUE BENEFITS THE TRIBAL COMMUNITY

- The Tribe utilizes gaming revenues for a variety of purposes that benefit the Tribal community, including environmental stewardship and workforce development
- The Tribe has also utilized gaming revenues to develop and operate facilities and programs that serve the Tribal community:
 - Early Childhood Development Center
 - Elders Center
 - Youth Center
 - Tribal Police



- The Tribal Administration Building is 26,000 square feet and includes a unique roof line reminiscent of the native salmon, as well as an indoor water feature and handcrafted cedar art
- The building houses the Tribal Council, Financial Services, Legal, Planning, Operations and Security



- The Health and Wellness Center opened recently and is just under 50,000 square feet
- It allows the Tribe to offer a variety of health-related services, including a medical clinic, dental clinic, pharmacy, natural healing center and mental health services

IV. GAMING REVENUE BENEFITS THE NON-TRIBAL COMMUNITY

- The Nisqually Red Wind Casino has become an integral part of the community surrounding the Reservation
- Gaming revenues are used to provide operational funding for area non-profit organizations
- The Casino also participates in area business associations, chambers of commerce and economic development groups
- The Casino is fully committed to buying locally to support local vendors and service providers
- There is no doubt that the economic benefits and employment opportunities created by the Casino ripple throughout the South Sound region

Nisqually Tribe Charitable Giving

The Nisqually Tribe donates millions of dollars each year to local non-profits and emergency agencies

The average in the past five years is \$1.7 million dollars

Chair Sizemore called the virtual meeting to order at 9:02AM and mentioned that TVW would be livestreaming the meeting. ID Griffin called the roll to ensure a quorum. **Chair Sizemore** asked for a moment of silence to acknowledge any law enforcement officers that lost their lives since the commission last met.

Tab 1

<u>Consent Agenda</u> Commissioner Levy moved to approve the consent agenda as presented by staff. Commissioner Lawson seconded the motion. The motion passed. 5:0

Interim Director's Report

ID Griffin reported that the accreditation process had started and that she would give a full report at the April Commission meeting.

ID Griffin spoke about the upcoming 2022 commission meeting schedule. She reminded Commissioners that in 2021 they approved the purchase of upgrading the commissions' existing travel recording equipment to be able to provide a hybrid version. Due to supply chain issues, the necessary components have not arrived. She asked Commissioners to consider keeping the April and May commission meetings virtual with the option for Commissioners to attend in person at a commission office if they wished. Commissioners agreed. Commissioners would like staff to continue to seek out best practices from other state agencies and report back at the April commission meeting on virtual hybrid options. **ID** Griffin suggested hiring a consultant team

with the expertise to determine how best to proceed and possibly have them present to the commission in April.

There were three changes to the upcoming commission meeting dates.

- April 14th commission meeting will be two days, adding April 15th. Commissioners agreed.
- June 9th and 10th will be canceled due to lack of quorum and replaced with July 14th and 15th. Commissioners agreed.
- October 13th and 14th will be changed to October 6th and 7th due to G2E conflict. Commissioners agreed.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was no public comment. Julie Anderson confirmed no activity in the chat room and no emails for public comment.

Tab 2

Presentation - Problem Gambling Awareness Month

Vice Chair Patterson (VP) introduced Tana Russell, Assistant Director (AD) of the Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling and Roxane Waldron, Program Manager (PM) for the State Healthcare Authority to present the materials for this tab. **VP Patterson** stated that gambling has a dark side associated with it and included an article in the commission packet for Commissioners to read.

PM Waldron presented a PowerPoint presentation and gave a quick update on problem gambling awareness month.

PM Waldron shared a short note from the Healthcare Authority leadership, "*Healthcare Authority is very supportive of and is working towards coverage of problem gambling treatment under Apple Health (Medicaid). However, the timeline for implementation will depend upon the approval by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare or a larger update being done to the related section of the state plan. Because of this, the earliest coverage would become effective July 2023, and is more likely to be January 2024. It could possibly even be later, depending on how negotiations with CMS go with this larger re-write of the section.*"

AD Russell thanks PM Waldron and stated that they have a great partnership. She also shared that the Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling is neutral on gambling and stated, "*We are not either for or against it. We recognize that for many people, it is fun and recreational and similar is to alcohol when it does cause problems for some people, those problems can absolutely be devastating. And so, we really advocate for those help services to be available to those who need them. And we have many partners, both in the behavioral health and industry side of things, working very hard to promote and fund awareness, outreach, and treatment services."*

Chair Sizemore asked if either Ms. Waldron or AD Russell knew if the individuals that are currently in a treatment facility are there because of an illegal activity such as online gaming or sports wagering.

PM Waldron stated that the data doesn't support online gambling on the treatment elements specifically. However, there may be findings that will come out. No preliminary findings yet. She said that although online gambling is illegal in WA State (except for legal sports wagering at the Tribal casinos), the Prevalence study did collect information about that and will be sharing that information with the Legislature, PG Task Force, and the public by June 30, 2022.

VP Patterson suggested that the Gambling Commission will need to consider whether to invest some time in crafting agency request legislation based on the Prevalence study.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was no public comment. Julie Anderson confirmed no activity in the chat room and no emails for public comment.

Tab 3

Presentation – Perry Technical Foundation

Tyna Antonson (SA), Christine Cote, Perry Tech President, Cathy Sterbenz, VP of Finance and Administration, Jason Lamiquiz, Associate Dean of Education and Tressa Shockley, Perry Tech Director of the Foundation presented the materials for this tab. Washington State Gambling Commission rules require licensees to get commission approval prior to offering a raffle prize that exceeds \$40,000 and offer raffle prizes over \$300,000 in a license year. Perry Tech is estimating the house to cost \$365,000. However, they estimate the value of the home will be \$450,000. Staff recommends approving Perry Technical Foundation to offer a raffle prize more than \$40,000 and to exceed the annual raffle prize limit of \$300,000 for their license year ending June 30, 2023.

Chair Sizemore asked the same question as last year regarding the timeline for the winner to produce taxes for the house and further asked if the timeline could be changed giving the winner more time if they needed to get a loan to pay the taxes for the new house. **Christine Cote** agreed with that change and said their website would reflect the change.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was no public comment. Julie Anderson confirmed no activity in the chat room and no emails for public comment.

Commissioner Levy moved to approve Perry Technical Foundation to offer a raffle prize more than \$40,000 and to exceed the annual raffle prize of \$300,000 for their license year ending June 30, 2023, so long as they have a valid license with the Washington State Gambling Commission. Commissioner Patterson seconded the motion. The motion passed 5:0

Chair Sizemore announced a 15-minute break returning at 10:45AM.

Tab 4

Presentation – Budget Update

Kriscinda Hansen, CFO presented the materials for this tab. CFO Hansen provided information on the agency's financial status between July 2021 through January 2022.

Commissioners Reeves thanked CFO Hansen for the comprehensive overview of the agency's past and future budget.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was no public comment. Julie Anderson confirmed no activity in the chat room and no emails for public comment.

Tab 5

<u>Rule Petition to Amend – Electronic Pull-Tab</u></u>

Ashlie Laydon, RC presented the materials for this tab. Diamond Game Enterprises, of Chatsworth, California, is proposing to amend several existing rules and adopt new rules in order to facilitate the adoption of a modern electronic pull-tab system that uses pull-tabs manufactured,

distributed, and dispensed on rolls. This modern system would include electronic encryption, validation, verification, and auditing processes. Staff has not seen or reviewed the electronic pull-tab system being proposed.

Randee Kerns, Diamond Games Enterprises, Director of Business Development and Compliance and **Jonathon McCoy**, Diamond Games Attorney spoke regarding the petition.

Vice Chair Patterson asked the petitioner if Gambling Commission staff had the opportunity to analyze the machine or system firsthand. RC Laydon responded that staff had not.

Commissioner Reeves asked if there was a video that showed how the machine worked. Mr. Kerns replied that they did not have a video currently but could bring one to the next commission meeting. **Commissioner Reeves** asked them to send the video via email regardless of what the commission does. **Mr. Kerns** agreed. He also stated that the machines are currently deployed in Maryland, Michigan, and Missouri. Commissioner Reeves asked a follow up question regarding workforce and if this machine would take away an individual's job. **Mr. Kerns** stated that the machine would still need maintenance to be done by an individual.

ID Griffin stated that if Commissioners chose to initiate rule making today, then WAC 230-17-192 would be the mechanism that is triggered that would require the manufacturer or the petitioner to submit the equipment to us within 30 days of us making that request. And it outlines the process of which we will evaluate the equipment, doesn't mean that we will agree to any sort of rulemaking.

Commissioner Lawson asked the petitioner if the player has to actually open the pull-tab when they receive it or does the machine read it for them electronically? Mr. Kerns said they are asking for a rule change to allow the machine to read and validate the pull tab without it being opened. **Commissioner Lawson** asked the petitioner if he wanted the commission to amend WAC 230-14-010 as well as since that WAC requires that the pull-tab be physically opened in some way by the player. **Mr. Kerns** said correct.

Commissioners Reeves asked the petitioners if he saw this machine as an expansion of gambling. **Mr. Kerns** replied it's not an expansion of gaming, it's a modernization of an existing rule.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was no public comment. Julie Anderson confirmed no activity in the chat room and no emails for public comment.

Commissioner Lawson moved to deny the petition as the request is not within the purview of the Gambling Commission but the legislature. Commissioner Levy seconded the motion. The motion passed. 4:1

Chair Sizemore called for a short break. Returning at 12:40

Tab 6

Rule up for Final Action – Sports Wagering Rules

RC Laydon presented the materials for this tab. On January 6 and 7, 2022, staff met with tribal partners to get feedback on the proposed rules. The feedback received suggested:

- Removing the proposed Chapter 230-19 WAC, and
- Adding a single statement to WAC 230-03-085 that sports wagering vendors must follow the applicable tribal-state compact provisions and tribal laws related to sports wagering.

A stakeholder meeting was held on January 18, 2022, with sports wagering vendors to communicate the proposed changes. Representatives from FanDuel, Draftkings Inc., and Sportradar were present. No concerns were raised. Staff recommends final action.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was no public comment. Julie Anderson confirmed no activity in the chat room and no emails for public comment.

Commissioner Patterson moved to approve for final action to be effective 31 days after filing with the Office of the Code Revisors on or after April 11th, 2022. Commissioner Levy seconded the motion. The motion passed. 5:0

Tab 7Default – Sit N Bull SaloonAdam Teal, Interim Legal Manager presented the materials for this tab.

Chair Sizemore asked if any representative from Sit N Bull Saloon were present. They were not.

Commissioner Levy moved to revoke the Sit N Bull Saloon gambling license number 05-09792 and 65-02519 as presented by staff.

Commissioner Patterson seconded the motion. The motion passed. 5:0

Tab 8

Legislative Update

Tommy Oakes, Interim Legislative Liaison (ILL) presented the materials for this tab. **ILL Oakes** gave a short recap of the 2022 legislative session. He announced the confirmation of Commissioner Levy. ILL Oakes will be back at the April commission meeting to give a wrap up of the 2022 session and talk about the next steps.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was no public comment. Julie Anderson confirmed no activity in the chat room and no emails for public comment.

Commissioner Patterson reminded the commission that the Problem Gambling Taskforce will be meeting to discuss agency request legislation for 2023 and that ILL Oakes and ID Griffin will be invited to that meeting.

Commissioner Reeves thanked ILL Oakes on his accomplishments this session and appreciates all his hard work.

Tab 9 <u>Director Hire Update</u>

Lisa Benavidez, HR Director presented the materials for this tab. HRD Benavidez provided an update on the status of the Director Hire. She said, "*At the February commission meeting,*

commissioners decided to move one candidate forward for the director position. Before a final offer of employment can be made, the top candidate must complete background checks. Part of that process is for reference checks to be completed. And then for the candidate to undergo a psychological exam and a polygraph exam. Those tests have been scheduled, but unfortunately could not be scheduled to be completed by this meeting date. However, they will be completed the week after next. And once those exams are completed, I will receive a written report from each examiner. I expect to have all of those results by the end of March. I've completed most reference checks with one final reference scheduled for next week. The plan from here is for me to pull together all of the information from the references and background checks and provide it to commissioners for review." HRD Benavidez stated that "Commissioners can continue the conversation about candidate qualifications in executive session, and then after move to the public meeting. Once in the public meeting, Commissioners can make a motion and an appointment decision at that time, if they are ready to do so." HRD Benavidez will coordinate Commissioners calendars for availability in the event they can meet and make a decision prior to the April meeting.

Chair Sizemore expressed his concerns regarding the process. Commissioner Reeves also expressed her concerns with the process.

- All substantial interest holders qualify to hold a license.

Source of Funds:

The company's source of funds for the licensing process came from their checking account. Their primary source of cash is from funding rounds from their investors.

Part III Staff Recommendations

Based upon the criminal history and financial background investigations, staff recommends licensing SimpleBet, Inc. with a Mid-Level Sports Wagering Vendor license.

Accreditation Update

On March 30, 2022, Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) assessors conducted their on-site examination of our policies, procedures, practices, and facilities to verify our compliance with the over 150 law enforcement agency accreditation standards. The on-site examination and inspection of our Lacey office was the last step of the process. Over the past several months, assessors completed a virtual review and an on-site inspection of our files, operations, and practices.

We passed the examination with no findings. In May, the examiner's report for reaccreditation will go before the WASPC Accreditation Committee for approval.

This process was not easy and required us to embrace reviewing policies and practices. Staff's consistent demonstrated compliance with these standards, agency policies and procedures made the process go smoothly.

A big thanks to Tommy Oakes, Emilynn Henderson and Gary Drumheller for their dedicated focus, teamwork, and collaboration to gain this outstanding recognition.

Why Accreditation

In approximately 2012, we decided to seek law enforcement agency accreditation through the WASPC to demonstrate our commitment to operate under industry best practices and standards. Agency accreditation increases public confidence and creditability, provides for annual agency self-assessment, strengthens understanding of agency policies and procedures by agency personnel, reduces liability and susceptibility to litigation, and enhances operational effectiveness. The benefits of agency accreditation outweigh the time and work it takes each year to continue to meet the approximately 150 accreditation standards.

To be accredited, we must demonstrate we are compliant with the accreditation standards by providing proof of "have-to practices", which means our policies meet the standards and staff can demonstrate they follow the policies. Even though we are a limited authority law enforcement agency, we must adhere to the same accreditation standards general authority law enforcement agencies must adhere to.

We were accredited in 2014 and reaccredited in 2018. Agencies must be reaccredited by WASPC every four years.

2022 LEGISLATIVE WRAP UP

Bills that affect the Gambling Commission:

- > SHB 1735- Peace Officers' Use of Force
- ESHB 2037-Modifying Standards for Use of Force by Peace Officers
- ESHB 1329-Concerning Public Meeting Accessibility and Participation
- > There are also budget items that will impact WSGC



SHB 1735- Peace Officers' Use of Force

- Expands upon the authority for a peace officer to use physical force, subject to the requirements to exercise reasonable care, in several civil instances, including: taking a person into custody for evaluation or treatment; taking a minor into protective custody; executing a court order; executing a search warrant; and executing a directive from a judicial officer or court.
- > This bill is dependent on the definition of physical force provided in HB 2037.
- ➢ Went into effect on March 4, 2022.



HB 2037- Modifying Standards for Use of Force by Peace Officers

- Defines force and authorizes limited Terry stops
- > This "force" definition works in conjunction with SHB 1735
- ➤ This law went effective on March 17, 2022



What Changes for WSGC

- > Policy and training changes will be needed for WSGC.
- Specifically, the definition of the use of force, it provides guidance for contacting occupants of residences when serving search warrants and other law enforcement-related stops.
- > These policy and training changes are happening now.



ESHB 1329-Concerning Public Meeting Accessibility and Participation

- Public agencies are encouraged to provide for increased public access and participation in governing body meetings through real-time telephone, Internet, or other readily available means of remote access to the meeting that does not require an additional cost for accessing the meeting. Public agencies are also encouraged to make an audio or video recording of, or to provide a streaming option for, all regular governing body meetings, and to make the recordings of such meetings available online for at least six months.
- When the public is excluded from a meeting because a governing body is holding an executive session, the purpose for excluding the public that is announced at the meeting must be entered into the minutes of the meeting



ESHB 1329-Continued

- Except in an emergency situation, the governing body of a public agency must provide an opportunity for public comment at or before every regular meeting at which final action is taken. Public comment can be taken orally at the meeting, or by providing an opportunity for submitting written comment prior to the meeting. The governing body may set a reasonable deadline for the submission of this written comment before the meeting. Written comments must be distributed to the members of the governing body.
- Public agencies may hold a meeting remotely or with limited public attendance when there is a declaration of an emergency and the agency determines it cannot hold a meeting in person with reasonable safety. If the meeting is held remotely or with limited public attendance, the public agency must provide an option for the public to listen to the meeting. This may be through the telephone, on a local cable television station, over the Internet, or through some other means. <u>This section is effective immediately</u>!

> All other sections are effective June 9, 2022




What Changes for WSGC

- This bill encourages state agencies to have a hybrid model of both online and in-person meetings.
- Agencies are required to provide an opportunity for public comment.



Budget Items Affecting WSGC Budget was Signed by the Governor on 03-31-22

- There are 3 items of note in the budget that will affect WSGC:
 - > Early partial repayment of our sports wagering loan
 - Criminal Justice Training Commission (CJTC) funding for our agents to the police academy
 - 3.25% salary increase for classified, WMS, and exempt state employees for appropriated agencies



Sports Wagering Loan

- Partial repayment in FY22
- > Treasurer will transfer \$3 million from our account by June 30
- > Will save interest by making partial payment




CJTC Funding

- General fund—state appropriation for fiscal year 2023 is provided solely for academy training for limited authority Washington peace officers employed by the Washington state gambling commission, Washington state liquor and cannabis board, Washington state parks and recreation commission, department of natural resources, and the office of the insurance commissioner.
- The state agencies must reimburse the commission for the actual cost of training.
- Up to 30 officers must be admitted to attend the basic law enforcement academy and up to 30 officers must be admitted to attend basic law enforcement equivalency academy.



Salary Raises of Classified and Exempt State Employees of 3.25 %

- Section 937 of the bill provides appropriations to agencies for a general wage increase of 3.25% effective July 1, 2022, for all classified employees that are not represented, WMS employees and exempt employees.
 - > WSGC will provide these same salary increases for staff.
