







Chair Sizemore called the virtual meeting to order at 9:34 AM and mentioned that TVW would be livestreaming the meeting. Director Griffin called the roll to ensure a quorum. Director Griffin confirmed a quorum. Chair Sizemore asked for a moment of silence to acknowledge any law enforcement officers that lost their lives since the commission last met.

There were 35 people in attendance.

Tab 1

Nisqually Indian Tribe

The Honorable William Frank III, Chairman, Nisqually Indian Tribe; Tina Griffin, Director and Julie Lies, Tribal Liaison presented the materials for this tab. Director Griffin began the presentation by explaining the process. The Honorable William Frank III thanked the Commissioners and staff for their work, he spoke about the history of the Nisqually Tribe. Tribal Liaison Lies provided a detailed account of the compact changes to the Tribe's Amendment.

Commissioner Patterson inquired on when the tribe expected to implement the higher wager limits and inquired on additional contributions to the community and to problem gambling. Chairman Frank stated that they were ready as soon as the amendment was signed.

Senator Conway thanked Chairman Frank for the presentation and asked about sports wagering. Chairman Frank stated that the Tribes sportsbook was finished and ready to open.

^{*} Governor Inslee issued <u>Proclamation 20-28.4</u> et al that suspended certain Open Public Meeting requirements, including in-person public meetings requirements for this Commission Meeting.

Public Comment

There was no public comment. TL Lies mentioned that there was no public comment that came through email.

Commissioner Levy moved to forward the proposed compact amendment to the governor for review and final execution.

Commissioner Reeves seconded the motion.

The Gambling Commission has signed a contract with a consulting firm that will present officially to the commission at the May meeting.

Senator Conway and Representative Kloba both suggested we reach out to WaTech for guidance. **Director Griffin** stated that the May meeting could be held at the Lacey headquarters. Public comment could be taken in person if they chose.

Chair Sizemore suggested that the Commission meet at a location in Olympia.

Legislative Wrap Up

Tommy Oakes, Interim Legislative Liaison (ILL) presented the materials for this tab. **ILL Oakes** gave a short wrap up of the 2022 legislative session.

Senator Conway asked ILL Oakes if limited law enforcement agencies have the necessary toolkit to recruit and retain qualified applicants. ILL Oakes asked if Senator Conway and Representative Kloba would partner with the agency to support a law enforcement contingent. Both Senator Conway and Representative Kloba said yes. Commissioners thanked ILL Oakes for his work during the 2022 session.

Chair Sizemore asked for public comment. There was none.

Chair Sizemore adjourned the public meeting at 10:22 AM and announced that the commissioners would be taking a short break then going into executive session to review the performance of an employee.

Launch of Self-Exclusion Program

On May 1, 2022, the agency launched a statewide self-exclusion program for persons to voluntarily exclude themselves from gambling at authorized house-banked card rooms and participating tribal gaming facilities.

While the rules passed in December 2021, they were not effective until May 1, 2022, which allowed staff time to:

- Develop the infrastructure and procedures for creating, updating, and distributing the self-exclusion list,
- Create and distribute internal control templates for licensees,
- Review and approve the over 40 house-banked card room licensees' internal control changes,
- Educate and train staff and licensees on the new program,
- Develop an appointment system for registrants to register in our Lacey office,
- Make available on our website information regarding the program and resources those seeking help with gambling problems and disorders,
- Provide licensees the ability to access the list electronically and test their access permissions, and
- Develop forms and internal procedures for the intake of forms, maintaining the list and managing the records in accordance with state records requirements.

We distributed over 5,000 resource cards in 8 languages to each licensee to provide to registrants of the program. These are also all available on our website. The Health Care Authority (HCA) graciously provided us with these cards. During distribution, licensees requested the resource cards to be translated into two additional languages, Cambodian and Taiwanese. We are pursuing this and will provide the proofs to HCA for their use once completed.

The registration forms are available in 8 languages and available on our website. The form will also be translated into Cambodian and Taiwanese.

National Indian Gaming Association's Trade Show

Rodney Joubert and I attended the NIGA trade show in Anaheim, CA. This provided us an opportunity to see new developments within the industry and meet with licensees since staff has not attended G2E since 2019. Open Public Meetings Act Proclamation Rescinded

Effective June 1, 2022, Proclamation 20-28 prohibiting in-person meetings and waiving and suspending laws and rules concerning RCW 42.56, the Public Records Act, and RCW 42.30, the Open Public Meetings Act, are rescinded.

Staffing Update

Our vacancy rate is currently 25.6% or 32 vacant positions. 16 of these vacancies are for special agent positions. Our special agent vacancy rate is 26.15% or 16 positions.

Since November 2021, we have filled the following positions:

- Director (internal hire)
- IT Security
- 1.5 Fiscal Analysts
- Special Agent Supervisor/Tribal Gaming Unit (internal hire)
- Special Agent/Tribal Gaming Unit
- Special Agent/Regulation Unit
- Special Agent/Licensing Unit

The internal hires resulted in additional vacancies. Six positions have become vacant since November 2021 and one new position was created to facilitate our IT modernization project.

HR is currently recruiting for 10 positions, 8 are for special agents.

SUBJECT: House-Banked Card Room Summary of Activity Fiscal Year Ended 2020

Fiscal Year 2020 Information

During the year ended December 31, 2020, there were 44 licensed house-banked card rooms. As of the date of this memo, one house-banked card room went out of business and did not submit their financial statements. Of the 43 that submitted their financial statements, 16 licensees reported a net income between \$2,510,208 and \$33,000; 27 licensees reported net losses between (\$62,576) and (\$2,022,759).

Financial statements are prepared on the assumption that the business is a *going concern*, meaning that it will continue in operation for the foreseeable future. An auditor or reviewer who concludes that substantial doubt exists with regard to the going concern assumption is required to issue an opinion reflecting this concern. Of the 43 licensees that reported for year ended in 2020, one card room (representing 2.3%) had a going concern issue reflected in their financial statement report. Of the 43 licensees that reported for year ended in 2019, two (representing 4.7%) had a going concern issue reflected in their financial statement report.

Special Agents from the Licensing Unit have reviewed all the financial statements that were submitted.

For fiscal year ended 2020, 43 house-banked card rooms submitted their financial statements, which is the same amount that reported for 2019. As of the date of this memo, the following changes have occurred with the house-banked card room licensees:

- Lucky Dragonz Casino received a new license.
- Club Hollywood has closed permanently.

Background

According to WAC 230-15-740, all house-banked card game licensees must submit financial statements within 120 days following the end of their business year. Licensees are allowed a one-time, 60-day extension if needed, and the majority of the financial statements are received on or about June 30 of each year. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, licensees were automatically extended the additional 60 days.

The type of financial statement licensees must submit is dependent upon the gross receipts from the card room:

Licensees are required to have the financial statements prepared by an independent, certified public accountant licensed by the Washington State Board of Accountancy and they must be prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, including all required footnotes or disclosures. The licensee is also required to report gross revenues for each licensed activity separately and present comparative statements.

In 2002, we began summarizing and posting on our website the financial statement information we collected from the house-banked card rooms. The financial statement summary provides users with the gross card room revenue as well as the overall net income or loss of the business.

The type of legal entity a licensee is (i.e. sole proprietor, corporation, or LLC) will impact how some costs are recorded to determine the overall business's net income or loss. This means that you cannot necessarily compare the licensees in terms of their net income or loss reported based on similar gross receipt levels. For example, some licensees record an owner's salary as expenses while some owners take owner draws, which does not impact the net income or loss.

Who Proposed the Rule Change?

Jan Espejo, Light and Wonder, Las Vegas, Nevada

Background

Jan Espejo, Light and Wonder, of Las Vegas, Nevada, is proposing to amend WAC 230-15-150, Selling and redeeming chips, to allow chips to be sold using debit cards.

The petitioner feels this change is needed because Light and Wonder has a new product called AToM which is a tabletop ATM (automated teller machine) that allows players to pay for chips using a debit card without leaving the table.

The petitioner feels the effect of this rule change would be the ability to purchase chips at the gaming table using a debit card.

Currently, only cash is allowed to purchase chips at gaming tables. WAC 230-06-035(3) allows for debit card transactions (i.e., electronic point-of-sale bank transfer), however, at cardrooms, all other transactions are taking place at the cashier's cage or at an ATM. There are no requirements regarding where an ATM is located within each cardroom. Players may obtain cash or cash advances from their debit or credit cards at an ATM.

Allowing debit card transactions at tables may allow for more control over cash withdrawals. In Nevada, operators can set daily limits on the amount of cash patrons are allowed to withdraw from their accounts. Those limits are set for each patron and require a 24-hour waiting period prior to any change to their limits. Currently, any limits on ATM withdrawals would be imposed by the patron's bank. In addition, a responsible gaming message is displayed either near the system or on a printed item given to the patron.

Other potential controls with the use of debit transactions may be less cash being transferred between patrons and operators and less chance of operators accepting counterfeit bills.

Staff noted that other rules in addition to WAC 230-15-150 may need to be amended to allow for debit transactions.

Policy Considerations

Staff has the following policy considerations:

- Will need to put controls in place to account for debit card transactions in gaming records (calculating win/loss for table (i.e., gross gambling receipts)).
- Changing current practice of cash-only at tables and allowing debit card transactions.
- Address responsible gaming with daily transfer limits, messaging, and other industry best practices.

Staff Recommendation

Under the requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act, the Commission must take action on a petition within 60 days of receiving it. Your options are:

- 1) Initiate rule-making proceedings by filing the rule as proposed for further discussion; or
- 2) Deny the petition in writing, a) stating the reasons for denial and specifically address the concerns stated in the petition, or b) where appropriate, indicate alternative means by which the agency will address the concerns raised in the petition.

Staff recommends initiating rule-making implementing WAC 230-17-192, Submission of electronic or mechanical gambling equipment during rule making, to ensure the equipment used to accept debit transactions for the purchase of chips meets all requirements of Chapter 9.46 RCW and that any rule changes address staff concerns.

Final Order – May 12, 2022 Commission Meeting

Michelle Ye has a gambling license authorizing Public Card Room Employee activity; Ye's license is not currently linked to an employer. Her license expires on June 3, 2022.

On January 21, 2022, a WSGC Special Agent was called by a member of the Macau Casino Staff, informing him that their surveillance staff had discovered a dealer had been paying out losing bets. That licensed dealer, Michelle Ye, and Xiaofan "William" Tong, the player that she had conspired to pay out the losing bets, had both been arrested at Macau. A review of the surveillance footage showed that Tong would place maximum bets of \$300 a hand across multiple wagering spots while playing at an empty table. If Tong's bet lost, Ye would still pay Tong as if he had won, placing the entire amount in one wagering spot in order to avoid detection. In all, Ye was found to have paid Tong on losing hands a total of twenty-one times, for a total of \$181,200 wrongfully taken from Macau.

Director Tina Griffin issued Ye a Notice of Administrative Charges and Summary Suspension Order on February 28, 2022, by regular and certified mail to her last known address on file. Pursuant to WAC 230-17-010, a response was required to be received by the Commission by March 21, 2022. To date, the Commission has received no communication from Ye.

Michelle Ye's failure to respond to the charges or timely request a hearing is a waiver of Ye's right to a hearing in Case No. CR 2022-00185. You may take final action against her gambling license. Ye wrongfully paid out losing wagers to a co-conspirator a total of twenty-one times, amounting to a total of \$181,200 fraudulently stolen from her employer. In doing so, Ye is in violation of RCW 9A.56.020(1)(a), 9.46.1961, 9.46.190, and 9.46.075(1), (2), (4), (8) and (10) and WAC 230-03-085(1), (3), and 9(a), (c), (d) and (e). Based on his conduct, Ye cannot show by clear and convincing evidence that she is qualified to keep her gambling license. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission sign the proposed final order and revoke Michelle Ye's Public Card Room Employee license, Number 68-35323.

- 5. Ermey continued that all of the incidents involved the same player, later identified as Xiaofan "William" Tong. Macau's surveillance team had documented twenty-one incidents over the course of five days of Ye paying out Tong as if his wagers had won, when they did not. Ermey estimated that Ye's actions had resulted in an over \$100,000 loss to Macau.
- 6. On that same day, the Agent received a call from Officer Howard Kim of the Tukwila Police Department. Kim had been dispatched to Macau regarding Ye's actions. Kim formally identified both Ye and Tong, and then placed them under arrest. Kim and the Agent agreed to share their respective reports.
- 7. On January 26, 2022, the Agent went to Macau to obtain video surveillance footage from the dates in question: January 13, 14, 15, 20, and 21 of 2022. The Agent reviewed the footage, and compared it to the surveillance reports that he had previously received. Aside from a couple of discrepancies, the Agent's review confirmed Macau's reports.
- 8. Comparing all twenty-one incidents, the Agent noted a pattern in Ye and Tong's actions. Specifically, all incidents were while playing mini-baccarat, all took place in Macau's high-limit area, and all took place when there was no supervisor present in the high-limit area. In all of the incidents, Tong was the only player seated and playing at the table. In each incident of theft, Tong would bet multiple spots, betting the maximum allowed in each bet (\$300). When Ye paid out the losing bets, she did so by paying the entirety in one spot, which is not correct procedure. Likely, this was done by Ye to avoid having her actions detected.
 - 9. The Agent's review concluded that Ye improperly paid out Tong as follows:
 - a. On January 13, 2022, at 10:15, Tong placed \$300 wagers on 9 different spots for the "Player" to win. The "Banker" won the hand, however Ye paid the

- 10. In total, over the course of the 21 incidents, Ye was responsible for paying Tong a total of approximately \$181,200 that he was not entitled to.

Ye's player tracking history showed that she had gambled on mini-baccarat hundreds of times between September 5, 2019 and January 20, 2022.

As a result, Ye in in violation of RCW 9.46.190, Violations relating to fraud, deceit, altering or misrepresenting, betting, or gambling.
- 4. Michelle Ye and Xiaofan Tong, over the course of at least twenty-one separate occasions, agreed to partake in a scheme that defrauded Macau Casino. After agreeing to do so, the two engaged in the performance of the fraudulent behavior, in violation of RCW 9A.28.040, Criminal Conspiracy.
- Michelle Ye has failed to comply with the provisions, requirements, conditions, limitations or duties imposed by the Gambling Act, which is grounds to revoke a license under RCW 9.46.075(1) and (8).
- 6. Michelle Ye has failed to prove by clear and convincing evidence that she is qualified for licensure, as required by RCW 9.46.153(1).
- 7. The Commission is authorized to revoke Michelle Ye's Public Card Room Employee license pursuant to RCW 9.46.075(1), (2), (8), and (10), RCW 9.46.153(1), and WAC 230-03-085(1), (3) and (9)(a), (c), (d) and (e).

IV. REVOCATION

- The above-referenced findings are a sufficient basis for revocation of Michelle Ye's Public Card Room Employee license.
- Based on the facts and violations referenced above, the penalty for Michelle Ye's actions is REVOCATION of her Public Card Room Employee license.
