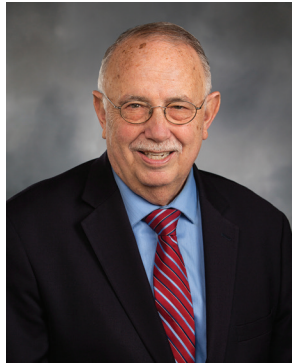

**Consent Agenda**

Chair Levy asked the Commissioners if they had any changes to the consent agenda. There were none.

**Public Comment:**

Chair Levy asked for public comment. There was none.

*Commissioner Sizemore moved to approve the consent agenda as presented by staff.*

*Commissioner Reeves seconded the motion.*

**Director's Report**

**Director Griffin** gave a brief update on the upcoming Centennial Accord that will be held at the Tulalip Casino on October 25, 2022. Director Griffin provided a summary of the commission's work with our tribal partners during the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, as published in the Centennial Accord report.

## Tab 2

### Petition for Review – The Pub Tavern

Andrea J. Clare, representing the petitioner, and Doug Van de Brake, representing WSGC, presented the materials for this tab. Ms. Clare presented oral arguments first. After Doug Van de Brake presented his arguments, the Commissioners adjourned to a closed session to discuss the case with their legal counsel.

After the meeting reconvened, Director Griffin called the roll to ensure a quorum.

Following the oral arguments and review of the record, the Commission denied the Pub Tavern's petition for review. The Commission affirmed, in its entirety, the administrative law judge's initial order, including the revocation of the Pub's Tavern license and adopted the initial order as the commission's final order.

## Tab 3

### Budget Review

**Kriscinda Hansen, Chief Financial Officer (CFO)** presented the materials for this tab. CFO Hansen gave a brief overview presentation and wrap up for fiscal year 2022.

**Commissioner Sizemore** inquired on the number of FTE's the agency now employees. **CFO Hansen** replied as of August 2022 the agency has 90 employees. **Commissioner Sizemore** affirmed that the agency would be fully staffed at 124 employees. **CFO Hansen** agreed.

**Commissioner Sizemore** also asked about the number of licensees that are declining. **CFO Hansen** replied that the nonprofits are lagging more so than any of the commercial licensees.

**Director Griffin** added that even though the agency is experiencing a cost savings because of staff vacancies, cost of goods and services continue to rise. **Representative Kloba** inquired on the licensing fees, so that it is more closely approximating the amount of money the agency needs to run the organization. **Director Griffin** indicated that the last time the fees were increased were in 2014.

**Commissioner Reeves** reiterated that the agency is not actually holding a cost savings or a surplus, they are reallocating resources at a higher rate in other areas and making up that difference elsewhere. **CFO Hansen** agreed. **Senator Conway** asked how often the agency raise the fees.

**Director Griffin** suggested that staff pull the data that the 2018 fee restructure was based on and aligning it with the revenue that the agency will need to collect for the group of licensees.

**Commissioner Reeves** added that the fee structure that we're proposing to continue using is sustainable, equitable, and inclusive. **Director Griffin** agreed.

**Chair Levy** asked if John Chang was present. He was not.

**2021 Washington State Adult Problem Gambling Prevalence Study Results**

In the 2018 Legislative Session, Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6032 directed the Gambling Commission to contract for a study to survey the scope of services available for pathological and problem gamblers and their families and analyze current prevention, treatment and recovery programs and services in our state.

Based on the study findings, we recommended the legislature form a joint legislative task force on problem gambling.

In the 2019 Legislative Session, Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 1109 directed the Gambling Commission to form a joint legislative Problem Gambling Task Force (PGTF), initiating an Adult Problem Gambling Prevalence Study and based on the study, make recommendations to the legislature about additional funding needs, licensing, certification, and additional areas of consideration.

In the 2020 Legislative Session, the legislature provided the Health Care Authority the ability to draw \$500,000 from the problem gambling account to initiate a statewide Adult Problem Gambling Prevalence Study, with a final report to be made to the PGTF by June 2021.

In the 2021 Legislative Session, Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5092 extended the final report due date to June 30, 2022.

On October 25, 2022, Chair Levy, commission staff and I attended the 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Centennial Accord Meeting hosted by the Tulalip Tribes at their beautiful Gathering Hall.

### **Sports Book Openings**

On October 20, 2022, the Cowlitz Tribe opened their sports book, which consists of a retail outlet and 16 kiosks.

On October 28, 2022, the Colville Tribe went live with their sports wagering operation at all three properties with kiosks at each facility and redemptions at the cage. Colville was the 12<sup>th</sup> sports wagering operation to open in Washington.

On November 1, 2022, Puyallup went live with their on-premises mobile sports wagering application. This is the second on-premises mobile sports wagering application to be launched in the state.

21 verify in writing to the commission that they have complied with all  
22 background check requirements prior to making any nonconditional  
23 offer of employment.

24       (b) The background check must include:

25       (i) A check of criminal history, any national decertification  
26 index, commission records, and all disciplinary records by any  
27 previous law enforcement or correctional employer, including  
28 complaints or investigations of misconduct and the reason for  
29 separation from employment. Law enforcement or correctional agencies  
30 that previously employed the applicant shall disclose employment  
31 information within 30 days of receiving a written request from the

13 (vii) A polygraph or similar assessment administered by an  
14 experienced professional with appropriate training and in compliance

17 assessment to be administered as part of the background investigation  
18 shall be administered in compliance with standards established in  
19 rules of the commission.

20 (c) The commission may establish standards for the background  
21 check requirements in this section and any other preemployment  
22 background check requirement that may be imposed by an employing

24 (d) The employing law enforcement agency may require that each  
25 person who is required to take a psychological examination and a  
26 polygraph or similar test pay a portion of the testing fee based on

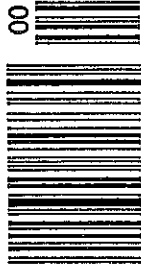

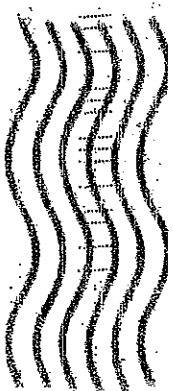

This matter was scheduled for a Motion Hearing by telephone on August 1, 2022, at 10:00 AM.

Simone Prince-Eichner, Assistant Attorney General, appeared and represented the Washington State Gambling Commission.

Mykhanh Nguyen, from FourCorners Translation, LLC, appeared as Vietnamese interpreter.

The Appellant/Licensee, Thu D. Le, did not appear.

The Motion Hearing was scheduled to convene at 10:00 AM. When Thu D. Le did not appear at 10:00 AM, the undersigned Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") waited 20 minutes for Thu D. Le to appear, until 10:20 AM, before convening.

After the ALJ convened the Motion Hearing, the Washington State Gambling Commission moved for an order of default dismissing Thu D. Le's administrative appeal.

The ALJ reviewed the file and observed that the Notice of Motion Hearing issued in this matter provided notice to the parties of the date and time of the Motion Hearing by telephone, along with the necessary phone number, code, and instructions for appearing. The Notice of Motion Hearing was mailed to Thu D. Le at her address of record on May 10, 2022. The Notice of Motion Hearing was not returned to the Office of



Administrative Hearings as undelivered. The Notice of Motion Hearing included a warning that failure to participate in the Motion Hearing could result in entry of a default order that would cost Thu D. Le her opportunity to challenge the Washington State Gambling Commission's action.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


"If a party fails to attend or participate in a hearing or other stage of an adjudicative proceeding . . . the presiding officer may serve upon all parties a default or other dispositive order, which shall include a statement of the grounds for the order."<sup>1</sup> In this case, Thu D. Le was properly served with the Notice of Motion Hearing set for Monday, August 1, 2022, and failed to attend and participate. Consequently, Thu D. Le is in default and her administrative appeal should be dismissed.

### ORDER

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. Thu D. Le is in default under RCW 34.05.440 and her administrative appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**.
2. All scheduled dates and deadlines are hereby struck.



**Who Proposed the Rule Change?**

Taek Kim, owner of Meeker St Bar & Grill in Kent, Washington

**Background**

**BOLD = Changes made after August 2022 Commission Meeting.**

At the August 2022 meeting, Commissioners accepted a petition and chose to initiate rule-making to amend rules related to pull-tab inventory control, specifically where “date in play” information from pull-tab games must be recorded. Before you today is draft language which:

- **Amends the requirement of pull-tab operators to write the date they place a pull-tab series in play on the purchase invoice. Alternatively, the pull-tab operator may write the date they place a pull-tab series in play on the game’s flare; and**
- **Clarifies what records pull-tab operators must record I.D. stamp numbers on. The previous requirement was vague simply referring to “in all records”; and**
- **Eliminates duplicative language related to distributors and invoice requirements. This information is already in WAC’s 230-16-190 and 195; and**
- **Amends language referring to I.D. stamps for consistency within the rule.**

Taek Kim, owner of Meeker St Bar & Grill in Kent, Washington is proposing to amend WAC 230-14-260 to no longer require licensed pull-tab operators to write the date they put a pull-tab series in play on the purchase invoice. The petitioner specifically wants to strike subsection (2) (b) of WAC 230-14-260.

The petitioner feels this change is needed because the requirement to write the date they place every pull-tab series in play on purchase invoices adds additional hardships for operators who do not use pull-tab point of sale/inventory systems. The petitioner noted that many operators already write the “date in play” information on the flare of the game or other separate tracking records after they place games in play. The petitioner feels that writing the date in play information also on the purchase invoices is duplication and not efficient. Furthermore, the petitioner feels that the date in play information written on purchase invoices does not add value to inventory control.

The petitioner feels that amending the rule in question will be positive for pull-tab operators who do not use pull-tab point-of-sale/inventory systems because it will save them time from trying to find pull-tab games on purchase invoices to write the date in play.

**Policy Considerations**

Staff has the following policy concerns:

- If pull-tab operators are no longer required to write the “date in play” information on purchase invoices, how will an operator know when they place each pull-tab series in play? Operators are required to write the date in play information on required monthly records, however, operators do not write that information on the record until after they pull a game from play. Some pull-tab games are in play for months before they are finally pulled from play.
- Some operators write the date in play information on the pull-tab game’s flare after they place it in play, however, that is not required by any rule. Some operators also write the date in play information on other tracking records separately prepared by the operator, however, that is also not required by any rule. If subsection (2) (b) of WAC 230-14-260 is removed, there will be no rule to require pull-tab operators to record the date in play information on any record.
- Operators that use point-of-sale/inventory systems are not required to write in ink the date in play information on purchase invoices. However, they still must type in the date in play information into the computerized system for game tracking purposes and so that the required monthly income summary can be generated with the information. The advantage of the computerized system is that the operator does not have to look through possibly dozens of pages of purchase invoices to find a single game to write the date in play information on.

**Staff Recommendation**

**Staff recommends filing for further discussion.**

This change is needed because it adds additional hardships to operators that don't use the pull tabs operating systems like "Wizards operating system". Furthermore, additional "put in date" data doesn't serve additional value to anyone. This rule was put into place before invoices are generated with I.D. stamp numbers with the advent of technology.

The effect of this rule change will be: The effect of this rule change will be positive for all pull tabs operators saving time without giving up any additional information.

**SUBJECT:** Special Olympics of Washington – 2022 Western Washington Enhanced Raffle Results

At the January 2022 commission meeting, the Commissioners approved a plan submitted by the Special Olympics of Washington (SOWA) to conduct an enhanced raffle in Western Washington. SOWA held the grand prize drawing on May 13, 2022.

In accordance with WAC 230-11-103, charitable or non-profit licensees conducting enhanced raffles must have an independent audit conducted on each enhanced raffle and the associated smaller raffles. SOWA submitted the auditor’s report in accordance with the rule.

The purpose of this memo is to report the results of the enhanced raffle and the agent’s review. This is the ninth enhanced raffle SOWA has reported on.

The grand prize offered was a dream home located in the Puget Sound area or an annuity of \$4,000,000 paid over 20 years or a one-time \$2,800,000 cash payment based on 84,000 tickets being sold. If fewer than 84,000 tickets were sold, the grand prize winner would receive a choice between a sum equal to 50% of the net raffle proceeds paid as an annuity over 20 years, not to exceed \$4,000,000, or a one-time cash payment of 70% of the annuity value, not to exceed \$2,800,000.

\* In addition to the prizes noted above, on grand prize drawing day at the Special Olympics Washington office on May 13, 2022, there were an additional 4,240 prizes awarded with prize values ranging from \$25 to \$1,000.

**Use of Proceeds:**

Net proceeds of \$1,523,958 from the Enhanced Raffle will benefit SOWA by supporting program activities.

**Regulatory Review:**

An agent from the Regulation Unit conducted an inspection of the enhanced raffle. Prior to the inspection, he reviewed the approved enhanced raffle plan and reviewed the case reporting system for compliance history.

The agent compared the enhanced raffle ticket sales to the bank statements and verified the money from all ticket sales was deposited. The agent noted 36,317 tickets were sold for the grand prize drawing and 42,494 tickets were sold for the Add-On drawing. The agent contacted the top tier Grand Prize Drawing winner, Multi-Ticket Drawing winner, the Add-On prize winner, and winners of the 2<sup>nd</sup> through 10<sup>th</sup> prizes. All winners contacted confirmed they received their prizes.

The agent noted the total grand prize amount awarded was \$1,194,977. The winner elected to receive annuity payments over 20 years. In addition, the Add-On prize awarded was \$100,000.

No discrepancies were noted in the calculation method of the grand prize.

The agent reviewed the licensee's gambling records to verify accuracy and compliance with WAC. He noted no discrepancies.

The agent confirmed that SOWA operated the enhanced raffle within the plan approved by the Commissioners.

**Regulatory Actions:**

There were no state or federal regulatory actions taken in relation to this enhanced raffle.

Special Olympics of Washington (SOWA) is requesting your approval to conduct a “Dream House Raffle,” an enhanced raffle in Western Washington.

In the 2013 Legislative session, the Legislature passed Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5723 authorizing enhanced raffles. Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 230-03-152 states the commissioners may vote to approve a bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization whose primary purpose is serving individuals with intellectual disabilities to conduct enhanced raffles when they meet the requirements of the law and submit a plan as set out in the rule.

**Mission:**

SOWA’s mission is to provide year-around sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic type sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities, giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy and participate in the sharing of gifts, skills and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes and the community

**Programs and Clients Served:**

SOWA currently serves more than 7,400 athletes and has a support system of more than 1,800 volunteers.

**Purpose for Conducting the Enhanced Raffle:**

To provide the necessary resources for the organization to enhance its programming and to grow its athlete base.

Ticket costs: \$150 each, 3-pack for \$400, or 5-pack for \$550.

**Security and Purchase of Prizes:**

All prizes will be purchased with the raffle revenue and awarded after each applicable drawing.

**Protection of the integrity of the raffle:**

Special Olympics Washington will conduct an audit of ticket stubs prior to each drawing. The audit will be performed by a member of the Special Olympics Washington staff who will use an Excel generated random list of tickets to audit. The tickets will be made up of the entire population of tickets sold, both active and voided. The sample size will be no less than 90 tickets.

All ticket purchase proceeds of the raffle, whether the tickets are sold in the Special Olympics Washington office by designated staff or through the call center, will be deposited into a Special Olympics Washington raffle account which is separate from the Organization's general operating funds.

An employee of Special Olympics Washington will draw all winning raffle tickets.

**Use of Proceeds:**

The proceeds will be used to further drive the vision of SOWA.

**Protection in the Event of Low Ticket Sales:**

The law requires that in the event SOWA determines the ticket sales are insufficient to qualify for a complete enhanced raffle to move forward, the enhanced raffle winner must receive fifty percent of the net proceeds in excess of expenses as the grand prize. The enhanced raffle winner will receive a choice between an annuity value equal to fifty percent of the net proceeds in excess of expense paid by annuity over twenty years, or a one-time cash payment of seventy percent of the annuity value. In no case will the grand prize be less than \$50,000. Unless the raffle ticket sales fall at or below the breakeven amount of 16,263 tickets sold, and net proceeds in excess of expenses produce a negative value, Special Olympics Washington will consider refunding all purchases and cancelling the raffle due to insufficient sales of tickets or issuing a flat \$5,000 to the Grand Prize winner.

**Projected Budget:**

SOWA estimates the breakeven number of ticket sales to be 16,263. The net proceeds will depend upon the grand prize awarded. SOWA estimates net proceeds to be between \$0 and \$5,281,885, provided the \$9,000,000 house is the grand prize.

**Dedicated Employee Responsible for Oversight of the Enhanced Raffle Operation:**

Mary Do, Chief Operating Officer of SOWA, will be overseeing the enhanced raffle operation.

**Licensed Service Supplier Managing the Enhanced Raffle:**

NZ Consulting, Inc., owned 100% by Neal Zeavy, is managing the enhanced raffle for SOWA.

**Licensed Call Center Contracted to Receive Enhanced Raffle Ticket Sales:**

Incept Corporation, owned 100% by Salvatore Falletta, will be the call center contracted to receive enhanced raffle tickets sales for SOWA.

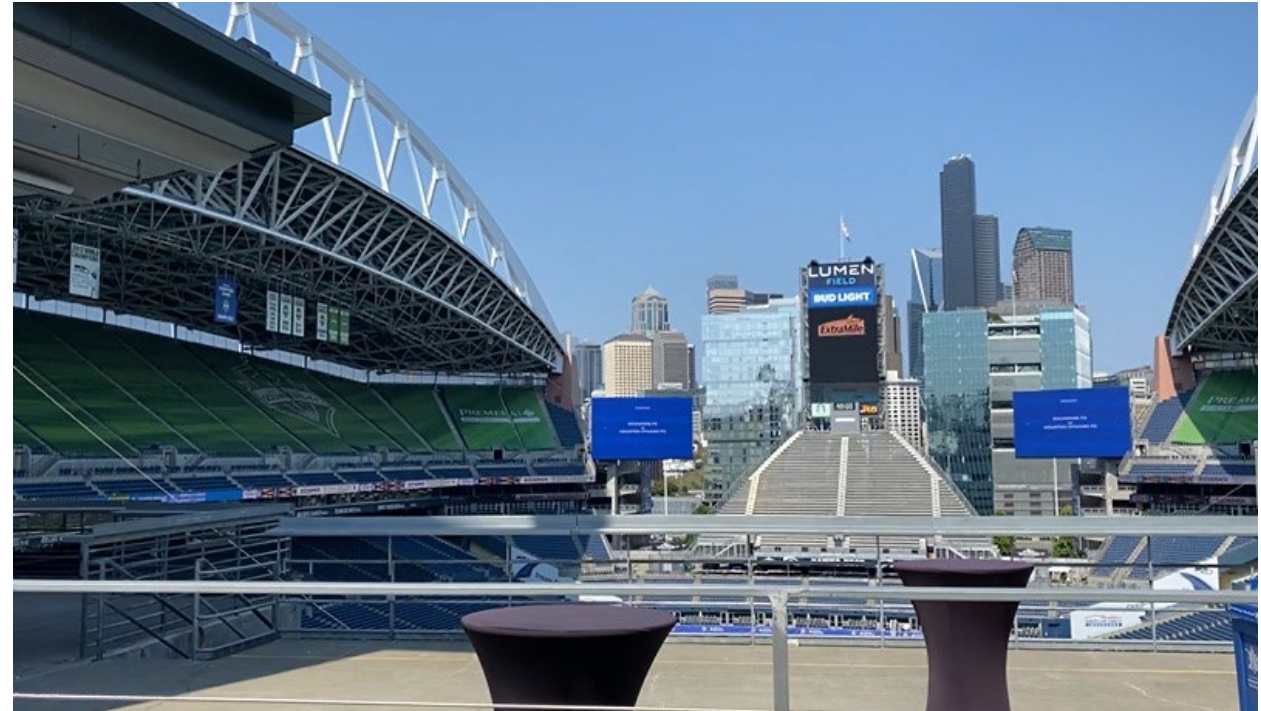

# Licensing Licensee/Organization Review

## Licensing Review

- *Nonprofit Organizations (One Roof Foundation and The Seattle Seahawks Charitable Foundation)*
  - Licensing staff reviewed the nonprofit organizations qualifications to ensure the applicants met the definition of “Bona fide charitable or nonprofit organizations” in relation to gambling activity and conducted criminal records investigations in accordance with RCW 9.46 and WAC 230.
- *Manufacturer (Electronic Raffle Equipment Bump Worldwide Inc.)*
  - Licensing Special Agents conducted a criminal history and financial investigation focusing on funding sources and beneficiaries for suitability in accordance with RCW 9.46 and WAC 230.
  - Staff went on-site to Ottawa, Canada, to conduct their investigation, which included verifying the ownership structure, reviewing financial and business records, and conducting interviews.

# EGL Equipment Review

EGL conducted an onsite review of equipment

- Reviewed home game authorized location
  - Verified equipment is in a secure location with limited access (WAC 230-11-310).
  - Verified the onsite server is on a secure closed network separate from the home game network (WAC 230-11-310).
  - Tested remote access to ensure it only occurs using a dedicated and secure communication protocol or application utilizing encryption such as a VPN (WAC 230-16-153).
  - Verified software signatures matched the signatures in the GLI certification

- Software to assist with sales, ticket printing, winning ticket verification and record keeping.
- Raffle Sales Units for selling tickets
- Portable printers for printing ticket receipts
- Video monitors at sales locations
- Credit card readers
- Back-end printers to print tickets for the drawing

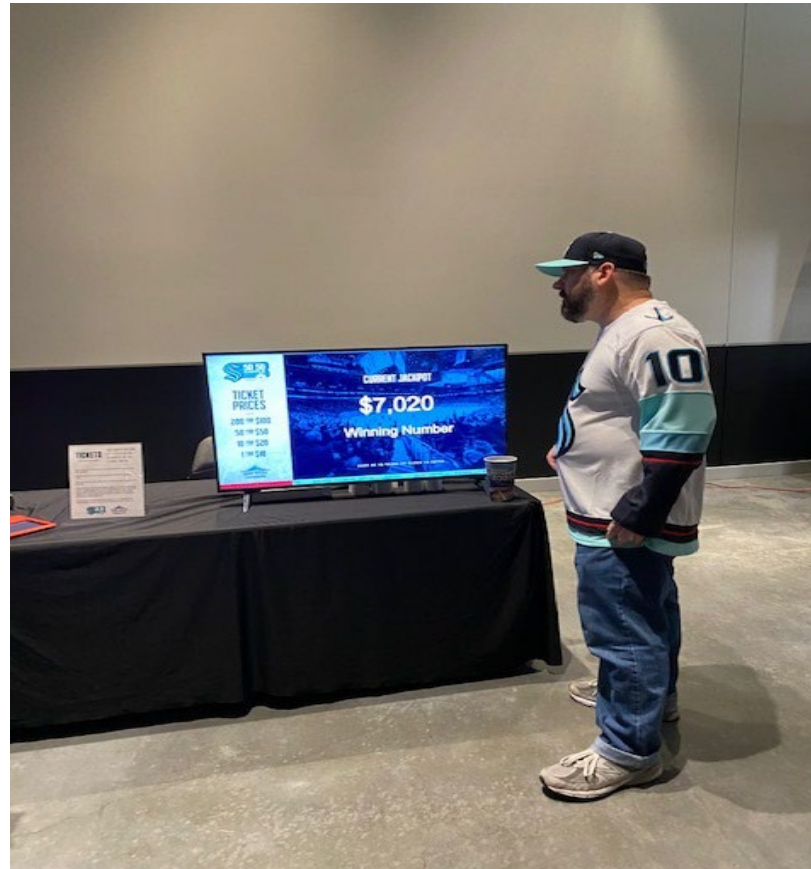
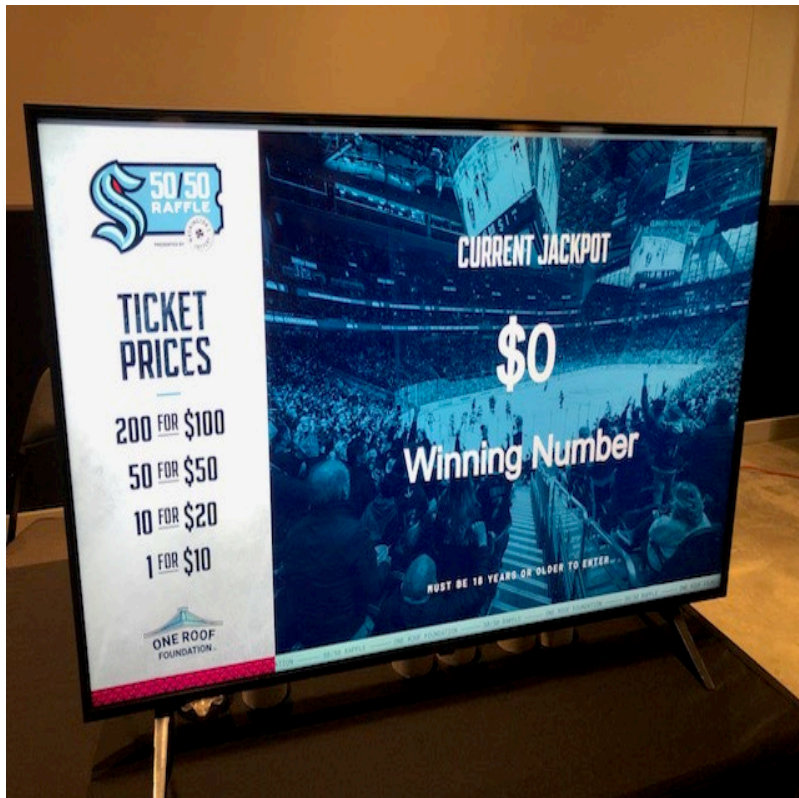
## Electronic Raffle Licensees must ensure:

- The equipment is working properly prior to and during the event.
- A licensed manager is onsite during the entire event
- Volunteers are trained for their assigned duties
- There are enough qualified volunteers and members to oversee all aspects of the raffle (sales, ticket printing, manual drawing, winning ticket announcement and verification and record keeping).

# Game Day Manual Drawing

## Manual Drawing

- Sales must be closed, and all tickets printed prior to the drawing.
- Volunteer or member mixes tickets prior to drawing and selects a winning ticket.
  - A licensed manager must be present
  - Winning ticket is verified in system as valid
  - Drawing must be recorded

- Total jackpot for first electronic raffle
  - 50% to winner and 50% to nonprofit
  - Prize Display in Lumen Field

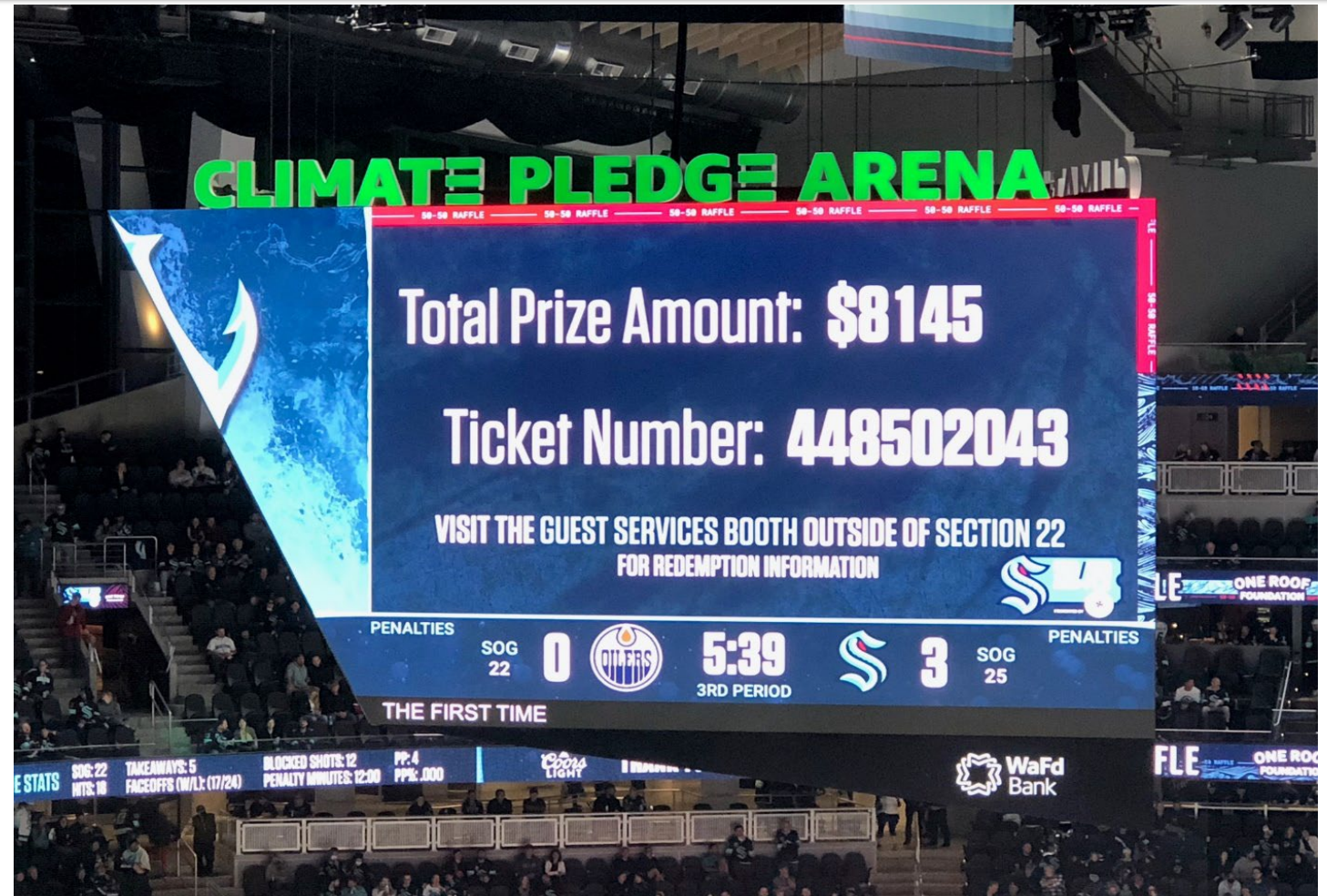

  - Jackpots totaled \$286,040
  - 50% goes to the organization to help fund programs.

  - Jackpots totaled \$202,100
  - 50% goes to the organization to help fund programs.

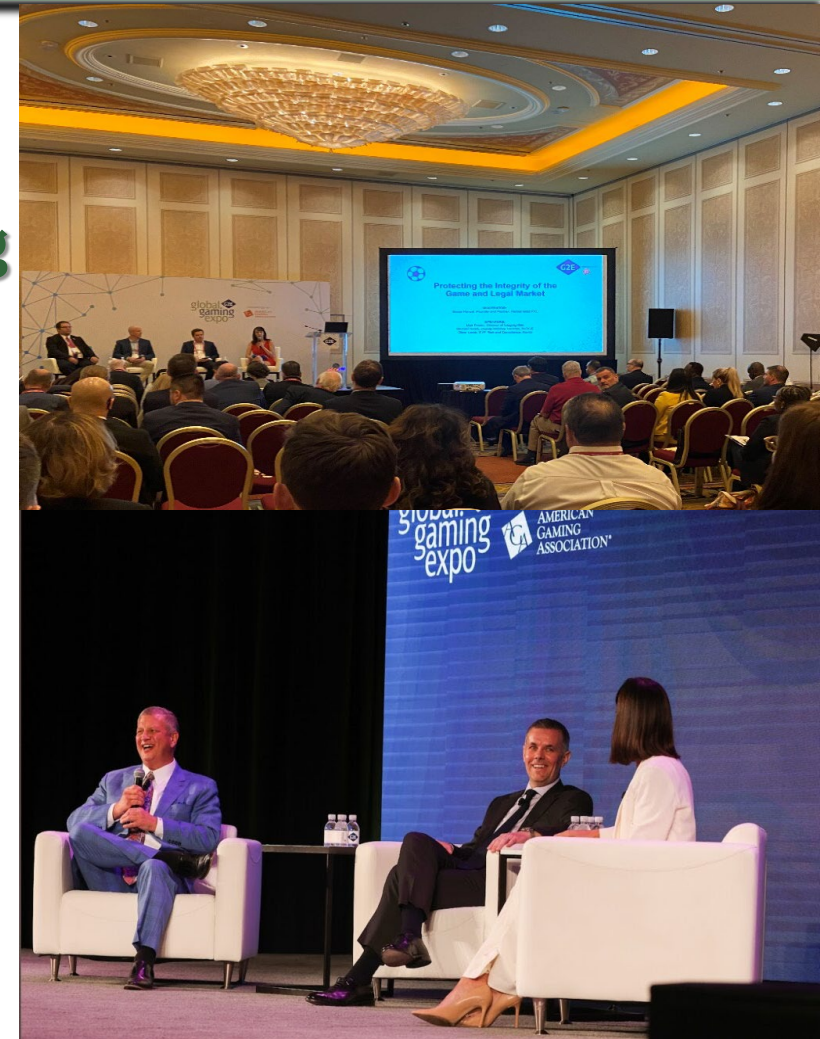

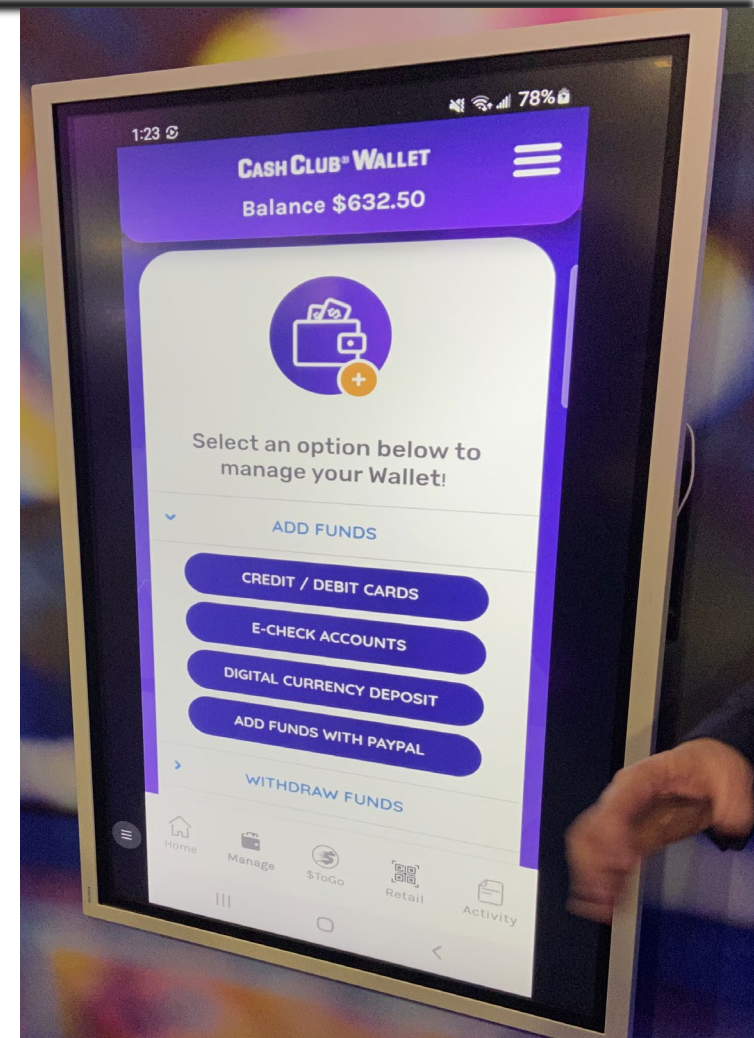

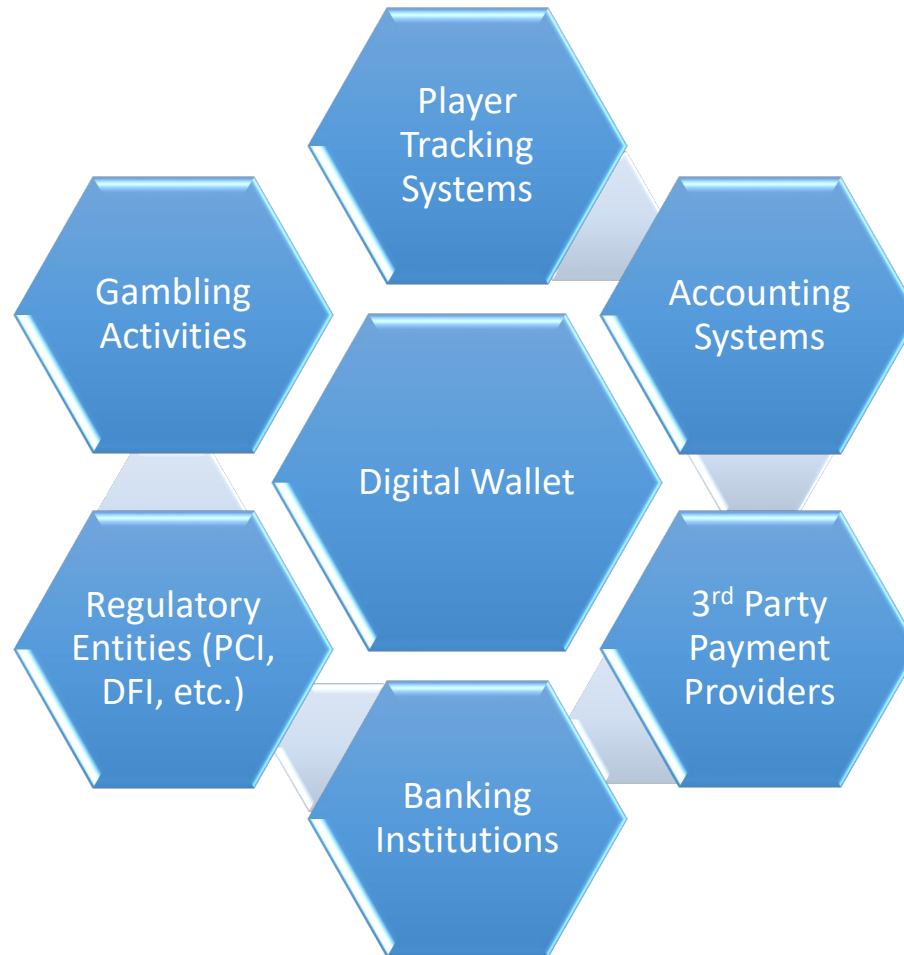
