Thank you for requesting approval to market the card game Baccarat World to Washington State commercial card rooms and Tribal casinos. Based on our review of the documentation we received from Ashford Gaming LLC, the Washington State Gambling Commission will approve the game under the conditions listed below:

The game shall be played and operated under the terms and conditions set forth under the Baccarat World rules of play you provided and are enclosed.

Commercial Card Rooms

- Commercial card room operators seeking to operate this game must first submit their internal controls and receive approval from the Commission prior to implementing.
- Manufacturers and distributors of graphic layouts and/or any other equipment associated with the game must be licensed by the state prior to the sale of the equipment.

Tribal Casinos

- Each Tribal Gaming Operation must request and obtain approval from their respective Tribal Gaming Agencies (TGA).
- Before TGA allows your game to operate, they will seek concurrence from our agency as well.
- In addition to your approved rules, the Tribal submission to us must include all supplemental information required by Tribal-State Compact Appendix A, Section 18.

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- Manufacturers and distributors of graphic layouts and/or any other equipment associated with the game must be certified by the state and licensed by the Tribe prior to the sale of the equipment.

Furthermore, any modifications to this game may affect this approval. Contact the Commission should you contemplate modifications. If you have any questions on commercial implementation, please contact Jess Lohse at (206) 786-3530. If you have any questions on Tribal implementation, please contact Kelly Main at (206) 423-4260.

Thank you for your cooperation and willingness to comply with the gambling laws of Washington State.

Rules and Dealing Procedures: *Baccarat World*

- (1) The *Baccarat World* wager consists of two betting opportunities:
 - a. The Banker side will win the next three consecutive hands.
 - b. The Player side will win the next three consecutive hands.
- (2) The *Baccarat World* wager loses if there is a tie or loss for the side chosen during the next three hands. Thus, to win the *Baccarat World* wager on the Player side, the Player side must win the next three consecutive hands. Likewise, to win the *Baccarat World* wager on the Banker side, the Banker side must win the next three consecutive hands.
- (3) A *Baccarat World* wager may be made on any hand, including those hands where the customer has an existing unresolved *Baccarat World* wager. The customer may make a *Baccarat World* wager on both the Player and Banker at the same time.
- (4) The payout for a winning *Baccarat World* wager on the Banker side is either 8 to 1, 8.5 to 1, or 9 to 1. The payout for a winning *Baccarat World* wager on the Player side is either 8 to 1, 8.5 to 1, 9 to 1, or 10 to 1. The operator may choose which payouts to offer.
- (5) The operator may choose whether to require a bet on the base baccarat game before placing a *Baccarat World* wager.
- (6) The customer may remove an unresolved *Baccarat World* wager prior to a new hand being dealt. This would be advantageous to the operator (like removing a *don't pass* wager after a point is established in craps).
- (7) Tracking the wager: After the desired hand wins (Player or Banker), the wager is moved from the *Baccarat World* betting circle to the first tracking spot. After the second consecutive win, the wager is moved to the second tracking spot. After the third consecutive win, the wager wins.
- (8) If the end of the shoe is reached and an unresolved *Baccarat World* wager remains, then the customer may either remove the wager or leave the wager in place until it is resolved during the next shoe.
- (9) *Baccarat World* is an optional wager on house-banked mini-baccarat. All rules applicable to mini-baccarat remain the same. Operators cannot allow wagering limits to exceed the authorized limits set out in WAC 230-15-040 and WAC 230-15-140.

Examples: *Baccarat World*

- (1) The customer wagers \$5 on the Player side of *Baccarat World*. The next three hands are all Player wins. The customer's wager wins 9 to 1, or \$45.
- (2) The customer wagers \$5 on the Banker side of *Baccarat World*. The next three hands are Banker wins. The customer's wager wins 9 to 1, or \$45.
- (3) The customer wagers \$5 on the Banker side of *Baccarat World*. The next two hands are Banker wins. The third hand is a tie. The customer's wager loses.
- (4) The customer wagers \$5 on the Banker side of *Baccarat World*. The first hand is a Banker win. The second hand is a Player win. The customer's wager loses.
