**Re: Candy Crush**

Dear Mr. Manning,

Thank you for submitting the Candy Crush amusement game, manufactured by Adrenaline Amusements, to us for review. In the information submitted, it was noted that this game has been modified for WA State. Specifically, the bonus wheel has been modified so that it awards the same number of tickets for each spin.

It is my understanding the game plays as follows:

This game is based on the Candy Crush app. Players touch the screen and attempt to match candies before time runs out to win tickets. Players win tickets based on their score at the end of the game play. If a player clears all jelly the wheel on the game spins. The wheel does not have a skill stop button for the player to push to stop the wheel on a specific ticket amount. Because of this, the wheel has been modified so the same number of tickets are awarded for each spin.

There are also 15 levels in the game. Once all 15 levels are cleared the player who clears the last level wins the Ticket Super Bonus which is displayed on the game. As each level is cleared, the game remains on that level until a player is able to move to the next level. The levels do not go back to level one after each game play.

The Candy Crush game meets the definition of an amusement game (RCW 9.46.0201) and is approved for use as a Group 5 Hand/Eye Coordination (WAC 230-13- 035) amusement game in Washington State.

Please be advised that any modifications to the Candy Crush amusement game software or associated equipment must be provided to us for additional testing and review. In addition, amusement games operated in Washington must not have settings that allow the operator to control the outcome of the game (auto percentaging). The approval of this equipment may be rescinded at any time if problems are

found by the Commission or changes to the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) impact this approval. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Sonja Dolson at (425) 277-7026.
