Executive Session

Chair Sizemore called the July 13, 2017 Gambling Commission Meeting to order at 9:06 a.m. He recessed the meeting to Executive Session at 9:06 pursuant to the RCW 42.30 and stated the Commissioners would discuss Tribal Negotiations, Pending Investigations and Litigation. He announced the Commissioners would return at 11:00 a.m.

-Public Meeting-

Chair Sizemore called the July 13, 2017 Gambling Commission meeting to order at 11:10 a.m. He welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made. Commissioner Troyer joined the meeting by phone.

There were about 30 people in attendance.

Tab 1

Consent Agenda:

May Commission Meeting Minutes/ /New Licensees

Commissioner Stearns moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented.

Commissioner Gray seconded the motion.

The motion passed. 5:0

Commissioner Troyer voted by phone.

Snoqualmie Class III Gaming Employees Licensees

Commissioner Gray moved to approve Snoqualmie Class III Gaming Employees as presented.

Commissioner Patterson seconded the motion.

The motion passed. 4:0

Commissioner Stearns abstained.

Commissioner Troyer voted by phone.

Director's Update:

Director Trujillo reported that Commissioner Gray will be attending the Commission meetings until the Governor appoints a new Commissioner to replace her. Her initial term expired June 30, 2017, but she can continue to serve as she was filling the unexpired term of a prior Commissioner. She will not be seeking another full six-year term with the Gambling Commission.

Director Trujillo stated that the agency has had a couple cases regarding financial exploitation of the elderly, where family members were gaining trust of their family and taking funds to gamble with. The story was on KOMO News and the Nevada News channel 31.

Legislative Update

Brian Considine gave a short legislative report. He reported House Bill 2213 was passed and signed by the Governor on June 27th. The agency would like to thank Representative Smith for helping us on this bill.

The Washington State 2017-2019 Budget passed. There was no direct financial impact to the Gambling Commission's revolving account or gambling activities. There was a 6% state employee salary increase, which will be phased in over three steps. The first of the three step process will begin July 1, 2017, the second step will be July 1, 2018, and the third and final step of the increase will be January 1, 2019.

Also, the Paid Family Medical Leave Act passed and was signed by the Governor. It was signed on July 5th; payroll deductions will start being collected in 2019. Benefits for that will start in 2020 and employees can start utilizing those benefits then.

Lastly, Brian updated the Commissioners on the New Jersey Sports Betting Case. New Jersey sued the NCAA and multiple agencies, challenging the Professional Amateur Sports Protection Act, PASPA, and have been litigating it since 2014. New Jersey passed a law, but the law was struck down at every level. They lost every appeal. On June 27th, the Supreme Court accepted the New Jersey Sports Betting Case, unexpectedly. The Supreme Court could hear oral arguments and have a decision on the case by June 2018. This could impact the 2019 legislative session as to what Washington should do related to sports betting.

Tab 2

Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe Compact Amendment

Washington State Gambling Commission Director David Trujillo, W. Ron Allen, Chairman, Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe and Washington State Gambling Commission Tribal Liaison Julie Lies presented the Power Point presentation for tab 2. Chairman Allen presented instead of CEO, Jerry Allen..

The Washington State Gambling Commission voted unanimously to forward the Jamestown S’Klallam Tribe’s Class III gaming compact amendment to the Governor’s Office for final consideration and signature. The Jamestown S’Klallam Tribe operates the 7 Cedars Casino in Sequim.

“The Gambling Commission is responsible for negotiating tribal gaming compacts,” said Commission Chair Bud Sizemore. “The proposed changes reflect current regulatory practices, reduce duplication between tribal and state regulators and clarify the roles for each party.”

Here is a summary of the major changes in the proposed amendment.

- Authorizes a second gaming facility, though the Tribe does not have current plans for a second facility.
- Allows the Tribe to operate any Class III table games authorized for play in Washington State.
- Replaces state certification of employees with state registration verification. The Tribal Gaming Agency will license new or renewing employees and then register them with the State.
- Continues the requirement that the State Gaming Agency conduct criminal history records checks that look for activities that may pose a threat to the public or effective regulation of this compact.
- Gaming employee registration with the State will be valid for three years unless disqualifying information is discovered; the State Gaming Agency will conduct criminal record checks annually.
- Limits registration so that it is not transferrable to other tribal casinos or house banked card rooms.
- The State Gaming Agency and Tribal Gaming Agency will conduct an annual comparison review to ensure records are consistent between agencies and licensure criteria is met.
- Incorporates the Tribe’s current internal controls that were approved by the Tribal Gaming Agency and concurred with by the State Gaming Agency, as the minimum operating standards. The Tribe may make changes to its internal controls with the State’s concurrence.
- The Tribe will determine when a tribal gaming agent will be present during gaming facility operating hours.
- The Tribe will provide information annually about problem gambling education, awareness, and treatment program services for tribal lands and surrounding communities.
- The Tribe and State have agreed to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding to define the schedule of fines and sanctions the Tribe or State may levy against a gaming employee or the gaming operation.
- The Tribe must enter into a Gaming Station Transfer Agreement to lease Class III gaming stations or tables from another tribe when it operates more than 60 tables.
- Clarifies keno standards.
- Provides a framework to review and approve a wide area progressive connected to the tribal lottery system.

Commissioners Stearns and Patterson thanked the panel for their work on the Compact.

Commissioner Patterson moved to forward the Jamestown S’Klallam Tribe Compact Amendment to the Governor for review and final execution. Commissioner Gray seconded the motion. The motion passed 7-0.

Ex-Officios Senator Lynda Wilson and Representative Brandon Vick were not present for the vote.

Commissioner Troyer voted by phone.

Petition for Rule Change - Ducks Unlimited

Assistant Director Tina Griffin and Mr. Scott Eisenhauer presented the materials for tab 4. Mr. Eisenhauer is requesting to increase the maximum value of a raffle ticket sold as part of a multi-component package in a members-only raffle from \$25 to \$100. According to the petitioner, by raising the maximum price of a raffle ticket from \$25 to \$100 for raffle packages containing multiple components, the proceeds of the raffle are far more likely to exceed the fair market value of the awarded prize. Commissioner Stearns inquired on the information needed to make the decision for an increase. Commissioner Patterson also inquired on the frequency of the request to increase.

Commissioner Patterson moved to initiate the rule-making proceedings by filing the rule as proposed for further action, as recommended by staff.

Commissioner Gray seconded the motion.

The motion passed. 4:0

Commissioner Troyer did not vote.

Tab 5

Request to Exceed Raffle Prize Limits - Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation

Assistant Director Tina Griffin, Mr. Bill Kenney, Eastern Washington Regional Director for the Elks and Mr. Douglas Doherty, Western Washington Regional Director for the Elks presented the materials for tab 5. Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation Inc. is requesting the Commission approve their request to exceed limits in raffle prizes exceeding three hundred thousand dollars in a license year ending February 26, 2018. The Commissioners had several questions about the request.

Commissioner Gray moved to approve the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Inc. exceed the annual raffle prize limit of \$300,000 for their license year ending February 26, 2018, as staff suggested, but not to exceed \$400,000.

Commissioner Stearns seconded the motion.

The motion passed. 3:1 Chair Sizemore voted nay.

Commissioner Troyer did not vote.

Public Comment

Chair Sizemore asked the audience for comment. There was no public comment.

Commissioner Report

Commissioner Patterson gave an update on the International Association of Gaming Advisors Summit she attended in June. She reported that the summit featured a wide range of very compelling topics between industry and regulators; also there were many academics at the meeting. Her primary focus was on the topic of problem gambling and how that problem is being

addressed from a global perspective, not just here in Washington State, or in this country, but how the entire world is addressing this problem.

She also mentioned that she was impressed with the government-to-government training she received in June [through the Governor's Office of Indian Affairs]. She suggested that the state give a mini version of that training to this commission.

Chair Sizemore said over the last month, staff has done a great job putting together a government-to-government summit with tribal leaders from around the state. There was good participation. Commissioner Patterson joined him at the meeting and it was held on June 26 at the Hotel RL in Olympia. Chair Sizemore would like to see the meeting continue in the future. He received good feedback. He thanked the staff for the work they did to put that meeting together.

He mentioned attending the Washington Indian Gaming Association (WIGA) meeting Wednesday, July 12 along with Director Dave Trujillo, Deputy Director Amy Hunter and Chief Financial Officer Mike Kashmar.

Director Trujillo added that he and agency staff have recently been invited to attend the last few WIGA meetings and Washington Association of Gaming Executive (WAGE) meetings, which are at the Tribal business arms, and the Tribal Gaming Agency Director meetings and the tribal state lab work group.

Chair Sizemore announced the next meeting would be at the South Puget Sound Community College Lacey Campus on August 10 & 11, 2017.

Meeting adjourned at 1:25 p.m.

Who Proposed the Rule Change?

Scott Eisenhauer, State Chairman, Ducks Unlimited Washington. As of June 9, 2017, there were 52 Ducks Unlimited chapters in Washington that held raffle licenses.

Petitioner’s Request

Mr. Eisenhauer submitted a petition for rule change “to increase the maximum value of a raffle ticket sold as part of a members-only raffle from \$25 to \$100. This rule change is necessary because it increase(s) predictability for licensees that a members-only (raffle), which involves selling tickets as part of a multi-component package, will result in a net profit for the licensee. By raising the maximum price of a raffle ticket from \$25 to \$100 for raffle packages containing multiple components, the proceeds of the raffle are far more likely to exceed the fair market value of the awarded prize.”

At the July 2017 Commission meeting, representatives from Ducks Unlimited explained that their rule change request would allow them to assign a value of up to \$100 for the raffle portion of their Bronze Sponsorship package, of which \$250 goes to conservation efforts. The ability to assign a higher value to the raffle tickets included in this package would allow the licensee to offset the cost of the raffle prize offered.

Policy Considerations

In 2009, the Legislature increased the cost of raffle tickets from \$25 to \$100. In 2009, the Legislature increased the cost of raffle tickets from \$25 to \$100. Today, when selling raffle tickets, bona fide and charitable organizations can charge up to \$100 for a raffle ticket. When using a pricing scheme, bundling tickets or discounting tickets, such organizations must follow WAC rules that authorize such alternative methods of selling tickets. The petitioner is requesting to modify the WAC to address the petitioners pricing scheme.

Licensees could include multiple tickets at \$25 each as part of a multi-component package under the current rule. For example, Ducks Unlimited could include four raffle tickets in their multi-component package at \$25 each.

WAC 230-11-087 Other pricing plans for members-only raffles. (1)

Licensees may sell multiple tickets to enter one or more drawings as a package if the total price of the package does not exceed twenty-five dollars.

(2) Licensees may include tickets to enter a raffle as a part of a package that includes dues, entertainment, or other fund-raising activities if:

(a) The package discloses the value of each component of the package to the purchaser; and

(b) The value of each individual raffle ticket does not exceed ~~twenty-five~~ one hundred dollars.

RCW 9.46.0277 "Raffle."

"Raffle," as used in this chapter, means a game in which tickets bearing an individual number are sold for not more than one hundred dollars each and in which a prize or prizes are awarded on the basis of a drawing from the tickets by the person or persons conducting the game, when the game is conducted by a bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization, no person other than a bona fide member of the organization takes any part in the management or operation of the game, and no part of the proceeds thereof inure to the benefit of any person other than the organization conducting the game.

WAC 230-11-086 Discounted pricing plans for tickets to members-only raffles.

In discounted pricing plans, licensees may sell tickets for a discounted price based on the number of tickets a player purchases if:

- (1) The amount of the discount is set before any raffle tickets are sold; and
- (2) Participants are allowed to purchase a single ticket; and
- (3) There is only one discount plan for each raffle; and
- (4) The cost of a single ticket, without a discount, does not exceed ten dollars; and
- (5) The total cost of a discount package does not exceed twenty-five dollars; and
- (6) The cost of a single ticket is printed on each ticket (for example, one dollar each); and
- (7) The discounted tickets are identified by a unique ticket audit numbering system; and
- (8) The licensee establishes an audit system that includes internal controls and procedures to determine gross gambling receipts from the sale of tickets using a discounted pricing plan.

On behalf of the nearly 12,000 members of Ducks Unlimited ("DU") in Washington state, I respectfully submit the below information in support of this Petition for Amendment of WAC 230-11-087. This Petition for Amendment is submitted pursuant to RCW 34.05.330.

Identity of Petitioners

Founded in 1937 by Joseph Knapp, DU is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation dedicated to conserving, restoring, and managing wetlands and associated habitats for North America's waterfowl. DU has a worldwide membership of approximately 700,000 individuals dedicated to this purpose. Complete information on DU's history and mission may be found here: <http://www.ducks.org>.

Petition for Amendment of WAC 230-11-087

I am requesting the following change (continued):

DU respectfully requests that the Washington State Gambling Commission ("WSGC") amend WAC 230-11-087(2)(b) to increase the maximum value of a raffle ticket sold as part of a members-only raffle from \$25.00 to \$100.00.

The change is needed because (continued):

This amendment is necessary because it increases predictability for licensees that a members-only raffle, which involves selling tickets as part of a multi-component package, will result in a net profit for the licensee. By raising the maximum price of a raffle ticket from \$25.00 to \$100.00 for raffle packages containing multiple components, the proceeds of the raffle are far more likely to exceed the fair market value of the awarded prizes.

PETITION FOR AMENDMENT

The text of the rule as it currently exists is as follows:

WAC 230-11-087

Other pricing plans for members-only raffles

- (1) Licensees may sell multiple tickets to enter one or more drawings as a package if the total price of the package does not exceed twenty-five dollars.
- (2) Licensees may include tickets to enter a raffle as a part of a package that includes dues, entertainment, or other fund-raising activities if:
 - (a) The package discloses the value of each component of the package to the purchaser; and
 - (b) The value of each individual raffle ticket does not exceed twenty-five dollars.

The proposed amended rule is as follows:

WAC 230-11-087

Other pricing plans for members-only raffles

- (1) Licensees may sell multiple tickets to enter one or more drawings as a package if the total price of the package does not exceed twenty-five dollars.
- (2) Licensees may include tickets to enter a raffle as a part of a package that includes dues, entertainment, or other fund-raising activities if:
 - (a) The package discloses the value of each component of the package to the purchaser; and
 - (b) The value of each individual raffle ticket does not exceed ~~twenty-five~~ *one hundred* dollars.

At least three reasons directly support the proposed rule change. First, the amendment increases licensee predictability that a raffle conducted pursuant to WAC 230-11-087 will ultimately be profitable. In DU's case, this issue is acutely observed when conducting the DU sponsor board raffles. These raffles typically involve the sale of a ticket as part of a package pursuant to WAC 230-11-087, with winners usually receiving a firearm. Historically, the package included an opportunity for DU members to pay a portion of their existing dues or pledged support. The relatively small number of tickets purchased for the sponsor board raffles, combined with the relatively high value of the prizes awarded, results in the individual sponsor board raffle potentially being unprofitable. The proposed rule change is designed to address the issue for DU and other similarly-situated charitable or nonprofit organizations

Second, amending the provision as specified above promotes regulatory conformity in that it brings the amended WAC 230-11-087 into conformity with the \$100.00 maximum raffle ticket price limitation found at WAC 230-11-014. Such an amendment simplifies the rules applicable to raffles, thereby assisting licensees in ensuring compliance. Additionally, such an amendment

facilitates the legislative authorization and intent found in RCW 9.46.010 and 9.46.0311 regarding raffle activities for nonprofit organizations.

Third, an increase in the maximum value of raffle tickets sold as part of a package is overdue, at least in part, as a standard adjustment for inflation. The \$25.00 limitation was first imposed in 1998, and, based upon research conducted to date, does not appear to have been adjusted since that date.

The effect of this rule change will be (continued):

The effect of the proposed rule change is that a raffle ticket may be sold for \$100.00 under WAC 230-11-087 as part of a package that includes other component, such as dues. This change would likely increase the revenue received from the raffle, thereby increasing the likelihood that the raffle will ultimately be profitable in light of the firearms (or other prizes) that are awarded.

The rule is not clearly or simply stated (continued):

DU believes the rule, as currently drafted, is sufficiently clear and simply stated. The proposed amendment to WAC 230-11-087 seeks only to change the specific dollar amount specified under the rule.

Additional factors under RCW 34.05.330:

RCW 34.05.330 encourages petitioners seeking repeal or amendment of an administrative rule to address a series of issues. The considerations identified in RCW 34.05.330, and DU's responses, are as follows:

- (1) Whether the rule is authorized.

DU response: *DU believes that the proposed amendment to the rule is authorized pursuant to RCW 9.46.070 and other existing statutory provisions.*

- (2) Whether the rule is needed.

DU response: *As articulated above, DU believes the amended rule is necessary to promote predictability for licensees, promote regulatory conformity with WAC 230-11-014, and reflect a periodic adjustment for inflation.*

- (3) Whether the rule conflicts with or duplicates other federal, state, or local laws.

DU response: *DU is unaware of any conflicts or duplication created by the proposed amended WAC 230-11-087.*

- (4) Whether alternatives to the rule exist that will serve the same purpose at less cost.

DU response: *DU has researched and proposed a regulatory interpretation under the existing version of WAC 230-11-087 that would address the concerns stated in this Petition for Amendment. Consultations with WSGC staff have occurred, and it is believed that the proposed amended WAC 230-11-087 satisfactorily addresses the concerns identified herein.*

PETITION FOR AMENDMENT

- (5) Whether the rule applies differently to public and private entities.
DU response: *WAC 230-11-087 applies only to members-only raffles conducted by nonprofit or charitable organizations.*
- (6) Whether the rule serves the purposes for which it was adopted.
DU response: *The proposed amended WAC 230-11-087 supports the legislative authorization and intent articulated at RCW 9.46.010 and RCW 9.46.0311.*
- (7) Whether the costs imposed by the rule are unreasonable.
DU response: *Any costs associated with the proposed amended WAC 230-11-087 are believed to be minimal or non-existent.*
- (8) Whether the rule is clearly and simply stated.
DU response: *As articulated above, DU believes the existing WAC 230-11-087 is clearly and simply stated, and seeks only to amend the specified maximum value of the raffle ticket. DU believes the proposed amended rule is clearly and simply stated.*
- (9) Whether the rule is different than a federal law applicable to the same activity or subject matter without adequate justification.
DU response: *DU is unaware of any substantive difference with federal laws or regulations on this subject matter.*
- (10) Whether the rule was adopted according to all applicable provisions of law.
DU response: *DU does not contend the existing version of WAC 230-11-087 was improperly adopted.*

SUBJECT: Recap of National Conference on Problem Gambling

From July 19, 2017 through July 22, 2017, I attended the National Council on Problem Gambling's annual conference in Portland, OR. The event also included a Tribal Summit on Responsible Gaming. Vice-Chair Patterson, Commissioner Stearns and Amy Hunter also attended the conference. There were multiple take-aways from attending the summit and the conference.

The Tribal Summit on Responsible Gaming was the first of its kind for the National Council on Problem Gambling. It was to discuss innovative responsible gaming practices for tribal casinos with key leaders from tribal gaming across the United States. The Summit also provided important networking opportunities for tribal leaders and casino executives with responsible gaming and problem gambling advocates and treatment providers. Vice-Chair Patterson and Commissioner Stearns also attended the Summit.

There were several important programs that were discussed during the Tribal Summit.

- The Mohegan Sun's self-exclusion program. Their program is five years. If the player violates, all winnings are surrendered and the player can be charged with trespassing. In addition, their program is unique in that the player can self-exclude online.
- The Oklahoma Association for Problem Gambling is a nonprofit organization that provides training for Oklahoma Tribal Casinos. This training includes a Tribal Responsible Gaming Certification and a self-exclusion program.
- The Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling has created an innovative online gambling employee training to recognize signs of problem gambling.

In addition, The National Council on Problem Gambling Conference offered a multitude of training and education surrounding problem gambling. I attended several training sessions

regarding self-exclusion. Washington State does not currently have a statewide self-exclusion program.

Self-exclusion is a procedure allowing people who have developed a problem gambling to create external controls to help them be more responsible in their gambling practices. Self-exclusion is seen as a responsible gambling practice by the industry.

There is a lack of uniformity across all states on how self-exclusion is operated. There are different policies (this includes penalties), length of self-exclusion, how a person enrolls, the removal process, jurisdiction of gambling facilities and allocation of money. All of these factors impact how the self-exclusion programs are run from state to state. Also, as mentioned above some states have no self-exclusion programs.

There are several facilities that offer successful self-exclusion programs. The British Columbia Voluntary Self Exclusion program uses GameSense which is a responsible gaming model. A player can enroll at the casino, at the BC Lottery Corporate office, or a staff person from BC Lottery will meet them in their community to enroll. The length of the self-exclusion can be 6 months, 1, 2 or 3 years. The player must sign up; another person cannot enroll on their behalf. If a player violates any winnings will be forfeited by the player and they will be asked to leave.

The Massachusetts Gaming Commission's Voluntary Self Exclusion Program uses GameSense too. Enrollment must be in person at the "GameSense," information center at the casino, at the Massachusetts Gaming Commission, or Massachusetts Council on Compulsive Gambling. The length of self-exclusion is 6 months, 1, 3 or 5 years or lifetime. If a player is found on the floor of any Massachusetts casino, they must forfeit all money wagered, losses or winnings. Additionally, the player remains on the self-exclusion list until they meet in person with a trained professional at the GameSense information center, Massachusetts Gaming Commission or the Massachusetts Council on Compulsive Gambling.

These two examples give you an example of how two separate self-exclusion programs operate.

Additionally, Commissioner Patterson, Amy Hunter, Ann Gray, Problem Gambling Program Manager at Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery, which is within DSHS, and I met with Susan Harris, Licensed Mental Health Counselor from Free by the Sea a drug and alcohol recovery center. Our meeting was very informative in regards to starting the discussion on an in-state residential treatment facility in Washington State for problem gambling. Washington State does not currently have an in-state residential treatment facility for problem gambling. Ms. Harris provided details of treatment offered and the desire to become a licensed residential treatment provider for problem gambling

Other sessions I attended included Tools and Tips for Working with Seniors, Minorities and Other Populations; Business Case for Responsible Gaming: Extreme Targeting: How to Reach Problem Gamblers, Regulators Roundtable including Commissioner Stearns: The Spiritual Seduction of Gambling and How Do Cognitive Distortions Change During Problem Gambling Treatment. It was a very intensive training.

Both the Tribal Summit on Responsible Gaming and the National Council on Problem Gambling Conference were beneficial on growing my knowledge in the problem gambling arena.
