These matters having come before the Washington State Gambling Commission (Commission) on January 12, 2017 and the Commission makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and issues its Final Order:

**I. FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Washington State Gambling Commission issued Licensee Lalith Mulatiyana License number: 69-38040, authorizing Class III Employee activity at Snoqualmie Casino in Snoqualmie, Washington.

2. Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana's license, which expires on April 12, 2017, was issued subject to the licensee's compliance with state gambling laws, Commission rules, and the Snoqualmie Tribe-State Gaming Compact.

3. In 2012, Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana inappropriately touched an eight year old female on her vagina.

4. On September 15, 2016, Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana was charged with Child Molestation, First Degree, under RCW 9A.44.083, in King County Superior Court, Case Number 16-1-06019-2.

5. Director David Trujillo issued administrative charges on October 26, 2016 alleging that Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana could not show by clear and convincing evidence that he

1 was qualified for licensure as required by RCW 9.46.153(1), and that his actions warranted  
2 revocation of his license pursuant to RCW 9.46.075(1), (8), and (9), and WAC 230-085(1), (3),  
3 and (8), and Section V.C. of the Snoqualmie-State Gaming Compact.

4 6. Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana was sent the charges by regular and certified mail on  
5 October 26, 2016, to his last known address.

6 7. The Commission received the certified mail on November 22, 2016 as  
7 “Attempted-Not Known, Unable to Forward,” as of November 18, 2016.

8 8. The Commission has not received any response from Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana.

9 **II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

10 1. Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana was sent proper notice of the October 26, 2016 charges via  
11 class mail and certified mail on October 26, 2016 under RCW 34.05.434, RCW 34.05.431, and  
12 WAC 10-08-130.

13 2. The Commission can take final action against Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana’s gambling  
14 license under Case Number CR 2016-01708 pursuant to RCW 9.46.075, RCW 34.05.440(1),  
15 RCW 34.05.461, and WAC 230-03-085.

16 3. Mr. Lalith Mulatiyana’s license should be revoked under Case Number CR 2016-  
17 01708 pursuant to RCW 9.46.075(1), (8), and (9), and WAC 230-03-085(1), (3), and (8), and  
18 Section V.C. of the Snoqualmie-State Gaming Compact.

1 **ORDER**


2 This matter having come before the Commission at its January 12, 2017, Commission

4 administrative record, and being fully advised in this matter, now therefore:


5 It is hereby **ORDERED** that Lalith Mulatiyana's gambling license, Number 69-38040,  
6 is **REVOKED**.



**NOTICE**

Reconsideration: RCW 34.05.470 and WAC 230-17-140 provide that a party may file a petition for reconsideration of a final order. A petition for reconsideration must be received no later than thirteen (13) days after the date this final order is mailed. Any motion for reconsideration must state the specific grounds supporting the party's request for reconsideration.

Stay of Final Order: Filing for reconsideration does not stay the effectiveness of this Order. WAC 230-17-145 provides that a party may petition the Commission for a stay of a final order. Any petition for a stay should be received by the Commission within thirteen (13) days after the date this final order is mailed.

Judicial Review: RCW 34.05.542 provides that a party may appeal this final order by filing a petition for judicial review within thirty (30) days after service of this order. A petition for judicial review must be filed with the appropriate superior court and served upon both the Commission and the Office of the Attorney General.

Service: This Order was served on you three days after it was deposited in the United States Postal Service regular mail, excluding the date of mailing. WAC 230-17-035.
