Dear Mr. Dangerfield:

Enclosed is an Order of Default entered by the Commission on November 16, 2017, revoking your license/certification to conduct gambling activities. This action occurred because you did not timely respond by requesting a hearing to the administrative charges filed on August 22, 2017 against your gambling license/certification.

You have the right to move to vacate this Order. If you do so, we must receive your request by the 10<sup>th</sup> day after the Order was mailed. Your motion must include the specific grounds upon which relief is requested and must be submitted to:

You also have the right to submit a Petition for Judicial Review. If you do this, you must submit it within 30 days of the date the Order was mailed. RCW 34.05.514 explains where you must file this petition and RCW 34.05.546 explains what information your Petition must include.

FINAL ORDER OF THE  
GAMBLING COMMISSION

Licensee.

These matters having come before the Washington State Gambling Commission (Commission) on November 16, 2017 and the Commission makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and issues its Final Order:

**I. FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Washington State Gambling Commission issued Licensee Charles Dangerfield, License number: 68-32753, authorizing Public Card Room Employee activity at the Freddie’s Club in Renton, Washington.

2. Mr. Dangerfield’s license expires on February 16, 2018, and was issued subject to Mr. Dangerfield’s compliance with state gambling laws and Commission rules.

3. Freddie’s Club uses a Sonoma Player Tracking System for its “Player’s Club”—a rewards program for players that rewards points based on time spent playing card games at the card room. Floor supervisors have access to and are able to manager a player’s point accumulation in the system.

1 4. Surveillance footage shows that between March 10, 2017 and March 30, 2017,  
2 Mr. Dangerfield, while working as a floor supervisor, improperly and unlawfully used Player's  
3 Club rewards that belonged to a customer, Charles Mazique.

4 5. On March 10, 11, 22, 24, and 30, 2017, Mr. Dangerfield accessed the Sonoma  
5 Player Tracking System and printed out a receipt for food comps using a kiosk or computer at  
6 the floor supervisor podium.

7 6. On the above dates, he would then order and receive food items from a waitress,  
8 and eat the food.

9 7. Mr. Dangerfield's fraudulent use of the card room's Sonoma Player Tracking  
10 System allowed him to unlawfully take \$102.00 in rewards points, which he transferred for food  
11 items.

12 8. Director David Trujillo issued administrative charges on August 22, 2017,  
13 alleging that Mr. Dangerfield's unlawful actions constituted theft in violation of RCW  
14 9A.56.050, and that he could not show by clear and convincing evidence that he was qualified  
15 for licensure as required by RCW 9.46.153(1), and that his actions warranted revocation of his  
16 license pursuant to RCW 9.46.075(1), (2), and (8), and WAC 230-085(1), (3), and (8)(a).

17 9. Mr. Dangerfield was sent the charges by regular and certified mail on August 22,  
18 2017, to his last known address.

19 10. The Commission received the returned regular mail on September 6, 2017 as  
20 "Return to Sender, Attempted-Not Known, Unable to Forward," and received the returned  
21 certified mail on September 27, 2017 as "Return to Sender, Vacant, Unable to Forward."

22 11. To date, the Commission has not received any response from Mr. Dangerfield.

23 **II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

24 1. Mr. Charles Dangerfield was sent proper notice of the August 22, 2017 charges  
25 via first class mail and certified mail on August 22, 2017 under RCW 34.05.434, RCW

1 34.05.431, and WAC 10-08-130, and had twenty-three (23) days after being mailed charges to  
2 respond, pursuant to WAC 230-17-010(1)(a), (b).

3 2. The Commission can take final action against Mr. Dangerfield's gambling license  
4 under Case Number CR 2017-00895 pursuant to RCW 9.46.075, RCW 34.05.440(1), RCW  
5 34.05.461, and WAC 230-03-085.

6 3. Mr. Dangerfield's license should be revoked under Case Number CR 2017-00895  
7 pursuant to RCW 9A.56.050, RCW 9.46.153(1), RCW 9.46.075(1), (2), and (8), and WAC 230-  
8 03-085(1), (3), and (8)(a).


9 **ORDER**

13 It is hereby **ORDERED** that Charles Dangerfield's gambling license, Number 68-32753,  
14 is **REVOKED**.

1 **NOTICE**

2 Reconsideration: RCW 34.05.470 and WAC 230-17-140 provide that a party may file a  
3 petition for reconsideration of a final order. A petition for reconsideration must be received no  
4 later than thirteen (13) days after the date this final order is mailed. Any motion for  
5 reconsideration must state the specific grounds supporting the party's request for  
6 reconsideration.

7 Stay of Final Order: Filing for reconsideration does not stay the effectiveness of this  
8 Order. WAC 230-17-145 provides that a party may petition the Commission for a stay of a final  
9 order. Any petition for a stay should be received by the Commission within thirteen (13) days  
10 after the date this final order is mailed.

11 Judicial Review: RCW 34.05.542 provides that a party may appeal this final order by  
12 filing a petition for judicial review within thirty (30) days after service of this order. A petition  
13 for judicial review must be filed with the appropriate superior court and served upon both the  
14 Commission and the Office of the Attorney General.

15 Service: This Order was served on you three days after it was deposited in the United  
16 States Postal Service regular mail, excluding the date of mailing. WAC 230-17-035.


